

Bureau Asks Details Of Christmas Plans

Some 170 letters querying churches, schools and organizations in the Klamath Basin, or plans for community activity or giving at Christmas time have been sent out by the Interagency Council Christmas Bureau.

The communication explains plans for a Christmas shopping center, to be patronized by parents of needy children where they may shop for clothing and toys.

Items would be paid for on a point system, to be determined by the number of children in the family and their ages.

A pilot project in 1960 proved to be a successful venture from the standpoint of all who participated, according to Mrs. Betty Coe, Christmas Bureau Committee chairman, and the committee seeks the same and broader cooperation this year.

Weekly meetings are furthering progress on the program. The next meeting to which representatives are invited will be Monday noon, Oct. 30, at Salvation Army headquarters. Those attending should take a sack lunch since there is no provision for meal preparation at the headquarters.

Response to date is encouraging, but all those who plan some Christmas activity are urged to send a representative or to indicate otherwise plans for distributing Christmas cheer.

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Winter Barley Program Announced By Chairman

More details on the 1962 winter barley feed program were announced recently by Earl Wilson, chairman, Klamath County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee.

The chairman explained that barley producers diverting a share of their acreage will receive payments for the diversion and they also will qualify for price support. At the same time, they will be making an important contribution to the nation in adjusting grain supplies and reducing government costs.

A barley producer can forego the diversion payments and still qualify for price support if he elects to devote the diverted acreage to one or more of these crops: Castor beans, guar, safflower, sunflower, or sesame. Adjustment in the diversion payment can be made if only a part of the diverted acreage is so used. Special program provisions enable growers of acceptable varieties of maturing barley to qualify for price support without participating in the barley feed grain program.

Millionaire Faces Count

NEW YORK (AP)—A millionaire who has become an ally instead of any enemy, and has begun to say "sorry" to other denominations, the former Archbishop of Canterbury said today.

Lord Fisher of Lambeth, former primate of the Church of England, told the British Council of Churches: "That is a most stupendous change, a complete new chapter in world history as well as in Christian history."

Lord Fisher said the trouble with politicians was that by their calling they were incapable of saying they were sorry.

"They have to prove they are right all the time. But salvation begins for groups of people only when they are able to say they are sorry, and that they were partly wrong," he said. "The Church of Rome has begun to say that, and so have we all."

Udall Plans Mountain Climb On Japan Visit

WASHINGTON (AP)—Of all the baggage being readied for a visit to Japan by five Cabinet members, that of Secretary of the Interior Stewart L. Udall will probably be the heaviest.

Udall and his four fellow Cabinet members will head a delegation that leaves next week for a meeting of the U.S.-Japan Joint Council on Trade and Finance. The others are Secretary of State Dean Rusk, Secretary of Labor Arthur J. Goldberg, Secretary of Commerce Luther H. Hodges, and Secretary of Agriculture Orville L. Freeman.

Secretary of the Treasury Douglas Dillon, originally scheduled to make the trip, has decided to send Undersecretary Henry Fowler in his place.

They will meet with their Japanese counterparts Nov. 24 at Hakone, a resort at the base of Mt. Fuji.

On Nov. 5, Udall hopes to scale 12,000-foot Mt. Fuji, even though heavy snows usually cover the mountain by then. That explains the luggage.

The Japanese government sent a list of things the 41-year-old Arizonian will need.

It included heavy, cleated boots; ski pants; a special snow cap; goggles; a windbreaker; a heavy shirt, and climbing irons.

Udall says he will take everything except the climbing irons, which he is having made in Japan.

Experts Probe Rocket Failure

VANDENBERG AFB, Calif. (UPI)—Scientists today sought to determine the malfunction which caused the second stage rocket of a Discoverer to shut off too soon, preventing the satellite from going into orbit.

An instrument capsule aboard Discoverer 33, launched from this base Monday, was lost in the South Pacific along with the 25-foot long satellite when its rocket engine failed to burn long enough to give the vehicle sufficient escape velocity.

The satellite had separated from the Thor booster and its rocket had fired on schedule, Air Force officers said.

Query Gets Underway

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Sen. John Stennis, D-Miss., who will direct the investigation, announced the date Tuesday in a statement issued through the Senate Armed Services Preparedness subcommittee.

Stennis said Maj. Gen. Edwin A. Walker, Army officer who was removed as a division commander in Europe amid controversy over his troop educational and training programs, can testify in person, if the general wishes, or submit a written statement.

He said the hearings will be conducted publicly in so far as security permits.

Sen. Strom Thurmond, D-S.C. who pressed for the Senate inquiry in a series of speeches and statements, is now overseas with an Army reserve group. He is a reserve major general.

California Loans Probed

SACRAMENTO (UPI)—Three U.S. Department of Agriculture farm loan administrators will be in California next month to investigate loans to farmers suffering economic loss from pear decline.

State Agriculture Director Charles Paul said Monday the party would include John Baker, director of Agricultural Credit Agencies; Howard Bertsch, administrator of the Farmers Home Administration; and Jack Frost, emergency loan expert for the administration.

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
