WASHINGTON (AP) — Federal Power Commissioner Howard Morgan said Wednesday he still had not made up his mind about running next year for the Democratic nomination for governor of Oregon.

He said the decision of Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton to seek the nomination "doesn't change my previous statements at all."

Morgan, who was appointed to the Power Commission earlier in the year, added, "My position remains unchanged for the time being."

Last week Morgan was quoted as saying he still was considering the "difficult decision" as to running for the nomination.

## Man Pleads To Assault

Sammie R. McKnight, 32-year-old Klamath Falls man, pleaded guilty in circuit court Tuesday after the charge against him was reduced from assault with intent to kill to assault and battery by the district attorney's office.

McKnight's trial had been scheduled to start Wednesday in Judge David R. Vandenberg's circuit court. But, after investigating the case, Deputy District Attorney Sam McKeen decided to reduce the assault charge from its most serious degree down to a misdemeanor.

McKeen explained that he had "insufficient evidence to prove assault with intent to kill or any lesser felonies."

McKnight had been accused of attempting to choke Mrs. Hood to death on July 30 at 1734 Lark Street. Judge Vandenberg will sentence McKnight Friday morning.

## GOP Plans To Capture Lady's Vote

The assistant chairman of the Republican National Committee called Wednesday for the GOP to go after the women's vote in 1962.

Mrs. Clare B. Williams, on the first day of a two-day tour of Oregon, made the statement in a speech in Portland to the Federation of Republican Women.

She said 58 per cent of the women voting in 1952 and 61 per cent of those who voted in 1956 favored Eisenhower for President.

In 1960, when Richard M. Nixon, the Republican candidate lost, 51.5 per cent of the women voted for him, Mrs. Williams said.

Mrs. Williams went to Eugene for a Republican dinner after her Portland speech. In a talk there, she said the GOP, as the loyal opposition, has the obligation to criticize the Kennedy Administration.

## Holocaust Results From Isolation, UN Speaker Warns

"For America to return to isolation would be the quickest way to the holocaust we want to avoid," Dr. Clifford Miller, Southern Oregon professor of political science, told an audience of 50 at the annual meeting of the Klamath Chapter of the Association for the United Nations Tuesday at the First Presbyterian Church.

"Walls are dangerous, whether the Iron Curtain, Bamboo Curtain, the cement wall in Berlin, or the walls that some would like to put around the United States."

He cited the imperfections of the United Nations, and the reasons why some feel we should pull out of it. With the increase of member nations the balance of power is going to the new nations, offsetting the rivalry between Russia and the U.S. Small countries who contribute little monetarily can vote equally with the U.S., who contributes about one-third of the budget.

For the first time non-white countries outnumber those predominantly white. This reflects the actual world situation, and is a fact which has tremendous meaning, he said.

He stated that when the chips are down the U.N. hasn't the military power to put down serious aggressions. All these facts are

disturbing to those who were in favor of the U.N. only as long as it served as an instrument of U.S. policy.

After citing the weaknesses of the U.N. Dr. Miller went on to list its successes in preventing or holding down violent outbreaks in Iran, East Indies, Pakistan, Israel, Korea. He stated that its economic and cultural achievements, in the long view of history, might prove to be its most decisive contribution as a bulwark against world communism.

Its flexibility and adaptability are in its favor. It is a step forward that many questions formerly settled by the Security Council can now be settled by the General Assembly, which is not hampered by the veto.

He ended by saying that we must extend our loyalties. Our scientific advancement is far ahead of our political institutions. Nations must cooperate or die together.
