## Policemen Place High

Two of the newest patrolmen on the Klamath Falls police force compiled outstanding records at a recent two-week police training course at Camp Withycomb near Oregon City.

Officers Charles M. Ellis and Olaf R. Johnson returned last Saturday from the camp. Ellis averaged 94 out of a possible 100 on test scores to place third in the class of 34 and Johnson's average was 92 good enough for fifth place.

It was the first class to complete the course. Funds for the program were appropriated this year by the legislature. City police officers and deputy sheriffs with less than one year of law enforcement experience are eligible. State police already conduct a recruit training school at the camp.

Both local officers agreed that the course was "highly worthwhile." They studied a series of subjects such as investigation, patrol techniques and police ethics. They also took firearms training.

### TO VISIT U.S.

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The State Department announced Wednesday that Indian Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru would visit Los Angeles on Nov. 12 and Mexico City on Nov. 14.

Nehru is due to arrive in New York City Nov. 5. He will go from there to Hyannis Port, Mass., to meet with President Kennedy, and then come to Washington.

## Bosworth One-Man Art Exhibit Opens Sunday

A one-man show of oils and watercolors by Robert Bosworth, Medford artist and architect, will open at 2 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 29 at the Klamath Art Association's Maple Park Gallery.

Members of the art association will honor Bosworth with a reception throughout the showing from 2 to 5 p.m. The public is invited without charge to see the exhibit which runs through Nov. 12 on Sunday afternoons.

A native of Klamath Falls, Bosworth attended elementary schools here and high school in Medford. He was graduated in 1956 from the University of Oregon where he was an outstanding architectural student.

After working in firms in California and Oregon, in 1959 he opened his own architectural design practice, devoting most of his time to painting.

"Bosworth, the painter, cannot be divorced from the Bosworth who designs buildings," said Gordon Gilkey, art director of Oregon State College. "His work is not like that of any other."

"Within the self-imposed limitations as to color and size, Bosworth, in his paintings, creates and develops significant visual statements of great lyrical beauty," Gilkey stated.

The young artist, who is married and has three sons, has exhibited extensively on the West Coast during the past two years. In California he has been given

one-man shows at Belvedere, Marie Morgensen Gallery in Santa Barbara, Shambrey Gardens International Festival of Art in Los Angeles and the Architect's Guild in San Francisco.

In Oregon he has shown at the Medford Art Association's Group showing earlier this year at the Maple Park Gallery. Bosworth is a founder and director of the Rogue Valley Art Association.

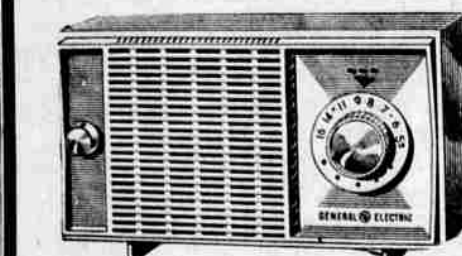
