Agencies Ready Plans On Water Development

WASHINGTON (AP) — High government officials, at the direction of President Kennedy, are working on plans for development of the nation's water resources.

The President has told four cabinet members to get agencies ready to move when and if Congress passes a bill which would set up a water resources council and river basin commissions and give money to states for planning.

The President has informed the Secretaries of Interior, Agriculture, Defense and Welfare that they will comprise the council.

The cabinet members were told to do preliminary work necessary so the council will be ready to function when and if the bill is passed.

Three have named aides to work on the project and they plan to confer on it next month. It was understood these aides are: Henry Caulfield, Interior; John Weber, Army engineer; and George Selke, Agriculture.

The departments are expected to review controversial budget bureau rules affecting water projects, contained in what is known as Circular A-47.

Object of the review is to decide whether criteria on which projects are justified should be liberalized.



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Civil Rights Proposals Talked For Next Session

dent Kennedy may ask Congress to act on civil rights proposals next year, Sen. Mike Mansfield, D-Mont., said Saturday.

Mansfield, the Senate Democratic leader, said he did not know which of several controversial proposals advanced by the Civil Rights Commission might be sponsored if the President decides to seek action.

Republicans who class themselves as liberals have criticized Kennedy for not recommending any new civil rights legislation. Some of them have indicated they intend to make this an issue in next year's congressional campaign.

Atty. Gen. Robert F. Kennedy has been under pressure from some Democrats to come up with specific legislative suggestions. But he is reported to have delayed any decision until early next year.

In a series of reports, the Civil Rights Commission has called among other things for legislation to ban racial discrimination in labor unions. It has proposed legislation to make completion of a sixth grade education sufficient qualification to pass literacy voting tests. It has asked for federal action to require local school boards to comply with the Supreme Court's integration ruling.

The commission also has urged Kennedy to issue orders against segregation in the National

Food Label Bill Brews

WASHINGTON (UPI) — A new grocery packaging and labeling bill appeared to be brewing in the Senate Anti-Trust subcommittee.

The subcommittee ended its second round of hearings on misleading practices in this field Friday.

"I think these three days have established that this is a field where practices have developed that are wrong," said Sen. Philip A. Hart, D-Mich., who conducted the sessions.

Talking with reporters, Hart noted that most witnesses connected with industry have urged self-regulation rather than more government interference. Others suggested that certain specific requirements might be established by law.

But Hart pointed out that grocery industry is "pretty big" for all segments to agree on such details as size of type on labels, definitions of a "serving," and the like.

Spy's Girl 'Undecided'

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The future of Polish-born Urszula Discher, ex-mistress of convicted spy Irvin C. Scarbeck, remained a mystery today to both U.S. and Polish officials.

The sad-eyed brunette has told friends that she has thought about going to Hollywood to seek movie stardom. The friends said they thought this was very unlikely.

But the girl who gave important testimony against the former diplomat was not available for comment on her plans now that his espionage trial is over.

Scarbeck, who was found guilty Friday of slipping secrets to Communist agents in Warsaw, passed the word from his jail cell that he felt Urszula should start a new life in the United States.

Those who have talked with her said that she cannot seem to decide whether to stay in this country, return to West Germany or go back to live with relatives in her homeland.

Testimony at the trial indicated that Scarbeck fed U.S. secrets to the Polish secret police (UB) in return for a passport that Miss Discher used to flee to West Germany.

Testimony disclosed that Scarbeck's troubles began last December when Polish police snapped pictures of him in bed with his sweetheart and blackmailed him for American secrets. He was then second secretary of the U.S. Embassy in Warsaw.

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
