

Nixon Calls On Kennedy Administration To Resume Atmospheric Atom Tests To Preserve Security

SYRACUSE, N.Y. (AP)—Richard M. Nixon, unsuccessful 1960 Republican presidential candidate, has called on the Kennedy administration to resume nuclear testing in the atmosphere to preserve America's security.

Nixon, making his last major speech in the East until after California's gubernatorial elections next year, told a Republican fundraising dinner Monday night the country could no longer be guided by "the neutrals."

The former vice president said he agreed with New York Gov.

Nelson A. Rockefeller that nuclear tests were necessary for the world's future. The above-ground explosions should be started immediately, he said.

"I agree with Governor Rockefeller that nuclear tests should be resumed in the atmosphere to preserve the security of America," he told more than 81,000 central New Yorkers who jammed War Memorial Auditorium. "We should not wait and take a Gallup poll of all the neutrals around the world."

"No nation in the world could be neutral if it wasn't for the power of the United States. They couldn't afford that luxury."

However, he said Khrushchev has determined to conquer the world. He hit hard at Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev, calling him a "bluffer" and a "poker player."

Gun Count Holds Two

Economy Jet Fare Eyed

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Continental Airlines, in a surprise move, has announced plans to introduce a new "no frills" jet economy service at fares 25 percent below present coach rates.

Continental, which operates west of Chicago, said Monday the new fares would go into effect Dec. 1 if the Civil Aeronautics Board approved. The service would involve elimination of meal and liquor service.

Continental President Robert F. Six called the proposed fare decrease "a major move to bring the cost of jet travel within the reach of millions of nonflying Americans."

"It has become evident that to get substantially greater numbers of people into the air, the cost of jet travel must be made comparable to the cost of travel by private automobile, train or bus," Six said.
