Police Hold Top Suspect For Arson

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — A tall crew-cut man afflicted with acne was in police custody today as the prime arson suspect in a series of downtown hotel fires here Monday night.

The suspect, James R. Aydt, 24, admitted he was among a crowd of 600 people watching a fire at the Stewart Hotel, the first of nine hotel blazes which broke out in rapid succession.

Aydt, who has served terms for vagrancy, told authorities he left the scene after two minutes and went directly to the West Hotel where he said he remained the rest of the night.

Several minutes after the Stewart Hotel fire, a blaze was reported at the Fielding Hotel just across the street. Five minutes later a curtain went up in flames at the St. Francis Hotel around the corner.

A tenant there reported seeing a tall youth with a pimply face dancing away from the building laughing to himself.

During the next few hours firemen raced to blazes at the Clift, Bellevue, Marlow, St. Francis Drake, YMCA, Owen, and Sheraton-Palace hotels.

Aydt attracted authorities' attention when a policeman reported observing a man fitting his description at the scene of the Stewart and Fielding fires. The officer said the suspect was watching the fires with great interest.

A check through police photo files revealed Aydt's whereabouts and he was roused from sleep at 3 a.m. He was asked to appear at city hall Tuesday morning, which he did.

Bomb Found At High School

PORTERVILLE (UPI) — A homemade bomb was found Tuesday night at Porterville Union High School, touching off a search of the institution today by 75 policemen, firemen and faculty members.

The bomb, three sticks of dynamite tied together with no fuse, was spotted outside the attendance room door by a janitor. The words, "Bomb, Nov. 1", were written in soap on a nearby window.

Superintendent Charles W. Eastbrook said classes would be held as scheduled.

On Oct. 19, the school's 2,000 students were evacuated and classes dismissed after a bomb scare. Two teen-aged girls were arrested later and admitted calling the false report to the fire department.
