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Beauty Tips For Teen-agers

Skin problems can be a very real embarrassment to a teenage girl, at a time when boys and clothes and dating are suddenly becoming so important. Here are some suggestions on ways to help keep your complexion looking happy:

Keep everything that touches your face meticulously clean. Wash your powder puffs frequently or use throw-away ones and shampoo your hair at least once a week. Keep hairbrush and curlers clean.

Hands off the face! No pushing, pulling or squeezing, please. This will only make the situation worse.

Watch your diet—concentrate on lean meats and green vegetables. Avoid fried and spicy foods, sharp cheeses, nuts and chocolate, and get plenty of rest and proper exercise. Drink lots of water and fruit juice.

When trouble breaks out, try a simple two-step treatment of cleansing and medication twice a day, morning and night. First apply a good medicated cleanser to gently remove pore-clogging oil, make-up and dirt. Leave it on a few minutes, then rinse off with warm water. Follow this with medicated lotion to help conceal, dry and heal acne blemishes. Dot it on overnight and use it as a powder base during the day.

Avoid clogging your pores with heavy creams and lots of make-up. Excessive use of make-up doesn't help you look more grown up, and it may complicate your skin problems. Wear a pastel pink lipstick and go easy on eyeshadow and mascara. A lightly made-up natural look is the most becoming one.

Most important of all, don't worry about your skin. Learn to cope with your complexion problems (and with others as well), and give your skin correct 24-hour care on a regular basis.
