Southern Oregon, with a perfect league record, is the Oregon Collegiate Conference football champion.

The Red Raiders clinched the title in the final conference round Saturday with a 39-0 victory over hapless Eastern Oregon.

Fullback Al Barnes paced the scoring assault with three touch-

downs on runs of 10, 8 and 4 yards. But the most spectacular performance was given by sophomore quarterback Doug Olsen, one of the nation's top small college yardage gainers. He completed 18 of 28 passes for 287 yards. One was a 37-yard touchdown heave.

Oregon College was held to a 7-7 tie by Oregon Tech but that was enough to keep it in second place, ahead of idle Portland State.

Clayton Ladd of Oregon College ran 74 yards to the game's first touchdown but a 48-yard scoring drive, capped by Harvey Graham's 69-yard run to the end zone, matched that in the final period.

Cook, Williams Owl Hoot Guests

The Owl Hoots, the Oregon Tech backers association, will honor Owl gridders Andy Cook and Hank Williams as the outstanding players in the Saturday 7-7 tie with Oregon College.

Cook, a transplanted guard, was named back of the week, while Williams was the top line-man, and both will be guests at the regular weekly Owl Hoot meeting scheduled tonight at 6:30 in the Broiler Restaurant. Earning honorable mention for their Saturday effort were Harvey Graham, in the backfield, and Wendell Winterbottom and Jim Madden, Owl line standouts.

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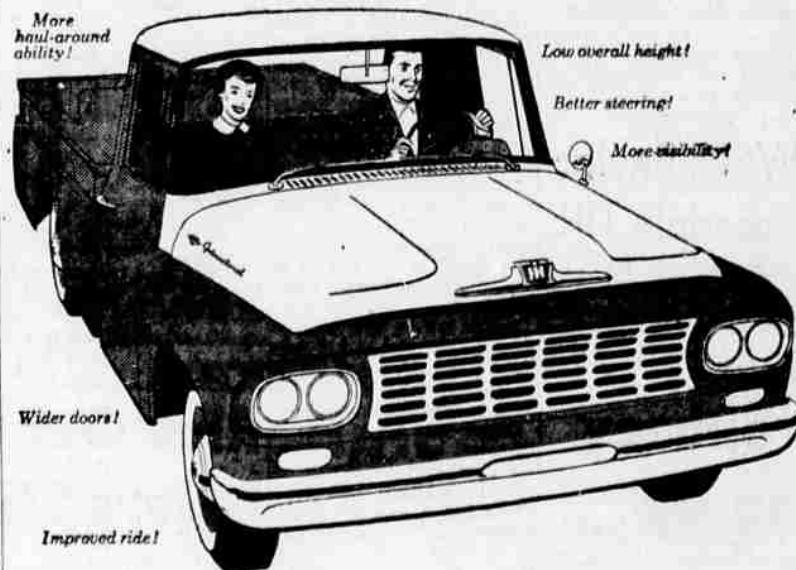
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Texas, LSU, Alabama Make Strong Bids For Nation's No. 1 Spot, Bowl Berths

Texas has won the statistical debate—at least for the present—from Alabama as to who should get the No. 1 spot this week among the nation's college football teams.

The Longhorns, the movingest team in college football with 17 miles in yardage in seven winning games so far, have the over-all edge on the Crimson Tide, which has also won seven games and can't enhance its reputation much

this week against Richmond of the Southern Conference.

The Longhorns should replace fallen Michigan State as the No. 1 team in the next Associated Press poll after the Spartans got bit by the jinx bug last Saturday. The Spartans (5-1) lost their fourth straight game to Minnesota in Minneapolis, 13-0, while Mississippi (6-1) failed to get by Louisiana State in their big one for the third consecutive year.

and had its winning string broken at 21 games, 19-7.

Texas, ranked first in over-all offense and with a defense that is as stingy as its offense is mobile, racked up Southern Methodist 27-0 after being ranked third last week. This week the Longhorns, first in the Southwest Conference with a 4-0 mark, go against foe Baylor, gradually working its powerful offense back into condition after being riddled by early season injuries.

Alabama (No. 4), which will play Georgia Tech and Auburn after Richmond and lay its claim to national honors on those games, skipped through Mississippi State 24-0 and took over as solid Southeastern Conference leader with a 3-0 mark. LSU is 4-0.

Texas and Alabama, in addition to Ohio State, which knocked off Iowa 29-13 in a Big Ten battle,

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NCAA Committee Chairman Takes Healthy Cut At AAU

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — The Amateur Athletic Union, assailed by athletes and officials alike, now has been attacked by a National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) committee chairman as a "domineering autocratic body" which has a desire for power.

Wilbur Johns, UCLA athletic director and head of the NCAA committee on AAU relations and Olympic organization, in a statement issued Sunday also accused the AAU as being of "bad faith."

The statement was issued, Johns said, to clarify differences between the NCAA and AAU and to give the public the "basic facts" involved in the dispute between the two groups.

Seeks Equal Representation
Johns stated the NCAA believes there should be equal representation of all sports groups in the organization which represents the United States to the international

federation governing each sport. He said the collegiate organization felt scholastic, collegiate, armed forces and AAU representatives should have a voice in the domestic organization for their sports.

Johns contends athletic competition of the present centers in

schools and colleges, and events designated "AAU" were, in fact, held chiefly at educational institutions with competitors and coaches drawn from those sources.

As a result, Johns added, the NCAA the past year and one-half has been attempting to establish a more democratic organization with equal representation for all interested groups and held four meetings to help resolve the problem.

Says Attitude Apparent
"As a result of these meetings," Johns stated, "it is apparent that the AAU officers have no intention of agreeing to any change which will in any way reduce their control of sports they have traditionally represented."

"The very fact that they are not willing to permit a democratic organization to become established with them being equally represented along with all constituent groups is evidence of their bad faith and desire for power," Johns concluded that under the NCAA proposal the AAU would be an integral part "but not the domineering autocratic governing body" it is at present.
