You Can Survive Atomic Attack

Fact — Fallacy: 95 Per Cent Can Survive

Many Americans are deceiving themselves about H-bombs and their effects. What are the chief fallacies and the facts?

Fallacy: Defense is hopeless. Shelters cannot really help.

Fact: Ninety to 95 per cent of us survive, with proper protection.

Fallacy: Fallout "poisoning" after a war would kill all life, everywhere.

Fact: This is pure fiction. Deaths from local, close-in fallout could be very high if people didn't have fallout shelter protection. But the worldwide radiation levels, after a war, would have delayed effects just about comparable to those from the normal radiation levels in some parts of the world at present.

Fallacy: No other countries, including Russia, are building shelters or preparing real civil defense. We look silly.

Fact: The Russians are civily defended, are preparing community shelters, and taking many other steps to save lives. We are already far behind them. Sweden and Denmark also have done a great deal in preparing shelters.

Fallacy: There is no hope for me if a bomb explodes within a few miles of me.

Fact: While there is no hope if you're directly underneath, fallout shelters could protect from blast many persons at marginal distances from the center.

Fallacy: A bomb is bound to explode right over my head.

Fact: Over the heads of each of 100 million Americans.

Fallacy: It would be impossible to set up civilized life again if cities and factories were destroyed and farmlands dusted with fallout.

Fact: Great areas would not be touched, including many cities and towns. We could rebuild the destroyed areas, if people had not been sickened or weakened by radiation. That can be avoided.



OVERSHADOWED — Fallacies often overshadow the facts concerning your chances of survival should nuclear war start.

Fallacy: Intense fallout would not cover our land, perhaps not more than 10 to 50 per cent at most. And there are means of decontaminating land, or of producing food while avoiding radioactivity hazards.

Fact: The radiation passes through foods or water without changing them, or making them unsafe, unless the fallout dust gets into the food or water. Coverings can keep the dust out.

Fallacy: X-rays from the fallout would not make people radioactive or "infectious" any more than chest X-rays do.

Fallacy: A fallout shelter is no good against blast.

Fact: Not against a direct hit. But most fallout shelters provide some anti-blast protection, and it can be very good protection.

Fallacy: The blast from big bombs totally destroys everything within 50 miles or more of the explosion.

Fact: Blast could bring down buildings eight miles to 10 miles away, in the case of a 10-megaton bomb. A 100-megaton bomb's

damaging blast effects would reach about 20 miles.

Fallacy: Instant radiation from an H-bomb reaches out many miles.

Fact: About two miles from a 10-megaton bomb. If you were that close, and unprotected, the blast and heat would kill you first, very likely.

Fallacy: Only the government can act for us.

Fact: There is much the individual can do for himself. Strong government aid and funds could speed the building of public shelters, community shelters, and shelters in schools.

Fallacy: All children in the future would be stillborn or genetic freaks, due to postwar fallout.

Fact: Postwar fallout would produce some considerable rate of increase over the present rate of abnormal births, but most births would continue to be normal.

Fallacy: Fallout contaminates the air it passes through.

Fact: The air is contaminated only while fallout is coming down, and it is safe to breathe when the dust has fallen. The air isn't changed by the passage of fallout.

Fallacy: In a nuclear war, people would give up, become animals.

Fact: They've usually helped one another and shared burdens in natural disasters, such as hurricanes and earthquakes.

Miller Orchestra To Play At OTI

An orchestra which will bring tears and smiles to Klamath Falls as they reminisce with music in the Miller Mood—The Glenn Miller Orchestra under the direction of Ray McKinley—will appear on the Oregon Technical Institute campus Nov. 16 at 8:30 p.m.

The orchestra's only appearance in Southern Oregon.

"String of Pearls," "Chattanooga Choo-Choo," and the bouncy "Pennsylvania six-five-thousand," will flood the OTI Little Theater when the Miller Orchestra recreates pre-war and wartime favorites which moved a nation.

McKinley and Miller's paths crossed several times while Glenn was alive. They first met while both were in the Ben Pollack Orchestra around 1930. When Maj. Glenn Miller went down in the English Channel during World War II, McKinley took over the famous Army Air Corps Orchestra.

McKinley himself is a drummer and the new Miller Mood group features his rhythmic beat.

Besides the several bands in which McKinley and Miller worked, Ray also stayed with the Dorsey Brothers when Glenn went to England with the Ray Noble orchestra.

In 1937, Miller began organization of his own orchestra, which caught the public fancy as war clouds gathered in Europe in the spring of 1939.

Besides his drumming, McKinley has been in radio, TV, and plays a top jazz set of "skins" on occasion.

Though the Miller craze died away with the years following the war, with the issuance of the movie, "The Glenn Miller Story," new interest in recreating those wonderful sounds of "In the Mood" and "Perfidia" came to the fore.

The Miller favorite, "The Glenn Miller Army Air Force Band" album, was immediately reissued. Much of the vocal and drum work on the war time album was McKinley.

The live re-creation of a Miller orchestra fell to the Miller estate and agent, Willard Alexander. McKinley was given access to the entire Miller music library and sent out with Alexander's backing.
