The Chicago Black Hawks are finally starting to act like Stanley Cup champions.

The Hawks, winners of the post-season competition in the National Hockey League in the 1960-61 campaign, routed the Toronto Maple Leafs 6-0 Tuesday night for their second straight victory.

It was the only game scheduled, but it had these results: Moved Chicago into sole possession of fourth place; prevented Toronto from moving past idle Montreal into first place; gave the New York Rangers, currently deadlocked with the Leafs, an opportunity to leap into the lead tonight when they meet Boston in the NHL's only game.

Coast Rivers Enjoy Good Salmon Runs

Up on the Rogue River and stable on the Umpqua summarize the reports from game commission fishery biologists on the spring chinook salmon runs in these two river systems.

According to Cole Rivers, fishery biologist at Grants Pass, the spring chinook run in the Rogue River this year reached just over 33,000 fish, one of the best runs on record for a number of years. The record shows this fine spring chinook run numbered almost 100 per cent over the parent run of 1957 which was tallied over the Gold Ray dam counting boards at just under 18,700 salmon.

The report indicated the spring steelhead run in the Rogue on a par with past years, and the fall run now moving up the river appeared to be good. The fall chinook run was thought to be a little weaker than in past years.

On the Umpqua, Jerry Bauer, fishery agent at Roseburg, reported the spring chinook run over the Winchester dam totaled over 5,300 fish as of Oct. 15. Although this was a 30 per cent increase over last year, it is only 56 per cent of the parent run.

The Umpqua summer steelhead run was tallied at approximately the same number as last year and for the second straight year shows a 25 per cent increase over the runs of the previous four years.

This, more than anything else, may bring the New Yorkers into a tie with the Birds for the conference lead with a victory.
