The reason may well be that they don't want their friends and neighbors to think they're scared. They prefer to take the shrug-of-the-shoulders, "I don't think I want to survive an atomic war anyway" attitude — since that seems to be the popular one at the moment.

But if the bombs ever start falling, everyone is going to be scared. And the ones who will be panicky-scared, who won't know which way to turn or what to do, will be the ones who right now are claiming they don't want to live through the horror of a nuclear war.

So the really brave person in every neighborhood is the one who dares to build the first bomb shelter and to urge his friends and neighbors to do the same.

It takes a lot more courage to face a horror and try to prepare for it as well as possible than to say airily, "I'm just not going to worry about it. If it comes, it comes."

If that idea can be gotten across to the American people—that the brave don't give up without a struggle and never have—then all

those who can will get busy building bomb shelters.

Some people seem to feel that the government owes us all protection from nuclear attack. Certainly it owes protection to those who can't help themselves.

But those who can, owe it to their country to get busy on their own, helping themselves, instead of sitting back waiting for Uncle Sam to look after them. That kind of staunch independence is what made our country and it is what will save it, even in the atomic age.

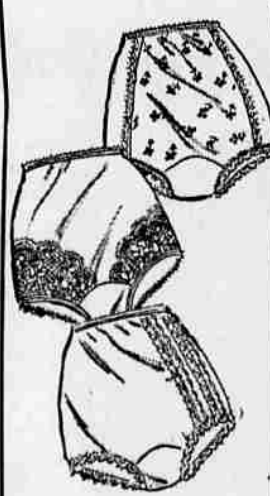
