State Psychiatrist Testifies Mitchell Not Mentally Deranged

Herbert Mitchell, accused gun slayer of Dmitre Dan Yerkovich, showed "no signs of mental disorder" on Dec. 27, when he was interviewed at the Klamath County Jail by Dr. P. K. Pati, supervising psychiatrist of the Oregon State Hospital, it was stated during testimony in the first degree murder trial of Mitchell in the circuit court of Judge David R. Vandenberg, Monday morning.

The defendant is on trial for the first degree murder of Yerkovich in a local theater last Sept. 8. One of two witnesses summoned by the state during rebuttal Monday, Dr. Pati told the jury that Mitchell did not display "any disorganization of thoughts or the thought processes during the interview."

However, to later questioning by deputy district attorney Sam McKoen the witness stated that the defendant "did not express much feeling of guilt or shame about the act he committed."

A doctor with a degree in his field from a university in his native India, Dr. Pati was one of two psychiatrists who has interviewed Mitchell to establish whether he was insane at the time of the shooting. The defense is seeking to prove that Mitchell was not responsible for the slaying by reason of insanity.
