## Bonanza Defeats Bly Bobcats, 71-36

**BONANZA (Special)** — The Bonanza Antlers got back onto the winning trail here Tuesday night when they trounced the Bly Bobcats in a Klamath County League contest, 71-36, with four players hitting in double figures.

The Antlers simply had too much gunning power for the Bobcats as they took a first quarter lead of 14-9 and increased it in every period. The Antlers chalked up 20 points in the second period, 19 in the third and another 18 in the fourth. Bly scored in double figures only in the third with 13.

**Bobby Layne Undecided**

LUBBOCK, Tex. (UPI) — Pittsburgh Steeler quarterback Bobby Layne, who says his arm is as strong as ever, will think about it awhile before making any decision on his future.

The blond former University of Texas quarterback seemed a bit unsettled Tuesday at suggestions made by Steeler coach Buddy Parker that he (Layne) had "played long enough." Parker said Layne's arm "is not as strong as it used to be."

"They don't say anything about Title (Y.A. Title, 35, New York Giants quarterback)... and I'm only one year older than Brown (Ed Brown, the other Steeler quarterback)," Layne said. National Football League records show Layne as 34 and Brown as 31.

"I don't have any idea what I will do," Layne said. "It's just something I've got to think about. It's too long from now till next season. It's not my arm. My arm is as strong as ever."

This victory gave the antlers a 2-2 league mark, two of the losses having come at the hands of Chiloquin.

## Contact Lenses May Aid Seattle's Eddie Miles

SEATTLE (UPI)—Now that he can really see the hoop, Eddie Miles, Seattle University's patented bomb sight, is shooting better than ever.

In fact, the 64, 200-pound Chief-ain senior is taking dead aim on All-America honors thanks to a pair of contact lenses.

"You know what?" asks Miles. "Last year I had to ask my teammates the score because I couldn't read the scoreboard. It was just a blur."

Blur notwithstanding, Miles connected on 47 per cent of his field goal attempts last season and averaged 23.3 points per game as the Chiefs finished with an 18-9 slate.

Oregon State dropped the Chiefs 69-65 in overtime in a first-round NCAA regional test to close out last season but Miles was on target with 10 of 14 long jumpers and six of eight from the foul line.

**Among U.S. Leaders**

This season, thanks to the contact lenses, Miles is averaging 24 points per game and ranks among the top college scorers in the nation.

"Now, it's just a big sunny day," says Miles, who usually teams with whirlwind sophomore Charlie Williams in the Seattle back court.

Miles picked up a flock of boosters in the recent Far West Classic at Portland where he was named to the all-star five although the Chiefs lost an overtime tussle to California in their opening game.

"I'd say Miles will be high on the draft list of the pros," said Rene Herrerias, California coach. "He's a great shooter."

"He has to go down as one of the best guards I've ever seen," added Jack Friel, former Washington State coach. "Man, can he shoot."

Vince Cazzetta, whose Chiefs now sport a 9-3 slate, is just as sold on his star.

"Eddie is good under pressure," says Cazzetta. "He always comes through when you need it. He works hard, has a fine attitude toward the game and he never loses his poise."

**Eyes Pro Career**

Miles is interested in playing professional ball and Cazzetta thinks he can make it.

"Now, it's just a big sunny day," says Miles, who usually teams with whirlwind sophomore Charlie Williams in the Seattle back court.

"His shooting went right down," says Cazzetta.

Now, when Miles bombs away out on the court, there's a spare pair guarded with loving care on the Seattle bench.

## Fight Plans Slated

NEW YORK (UPI) — President Tom Bolan of Championship Sports, Inc., says the site and date for the return Sonny Liston-Floyd Patterson heavyweight title fight, already picked, will be announced today or Thursday.

It will not be staged at Las Vegas, Nev., where the state commission voted Tuesday to reject any application for a license to hold the 15-rounder in Nevada.

Bolan stressed that the site and date were agreed upon Sunday and that no Nevada application was made.

At Miami Beach, City Manager James Puskin admitted that CSI had been making "preliminary negotiations" to rent the Miami Beach Convention Hall for the big fight.

And Fred Aaronson, chairman of the commission, would approve the fight if application were made.

Nothing has been heard from the two other cities under consideration—Baltimore and Cleveland—and probably won't Liston's adviser, Jack Nilon, favored Baltimore so heartily that Patterson reportedly shied away. And Cleveland never figured high in the conferences.

Bolan disclosed that champion Liston has started training at Chicago and that Patterson has been conditioning at Highland Mills, N.Y., for several weeks.

Liston took the title from Patterson on a knockout at 2:06 of the first round in their fight at Chicago Sept. 25. It was the quickest capture of the heavy crown in ring history.

## Hornsby Funeral Slated Today

CHICAGO (UPI) — The body of Rogers Hornsby was headed today for its final resting place at a little cemetery in Hornsby's Bend, about nine miles from Austin, Tex.

It was to be the second funeral in two days for baseball's greatest righthanded hitter, who succumbed to a heart ailment Saturday in a Chicago hospital at the age of 66.

More than 100 honorary pallbearers were named for the final rites at Hornsby's Bend.

Twelve honorary pallbearers attended Tuesday's memorial service in Chicago. They included three Hall of Fame players—Ray Schalk, Gabby Hartnett and Ted Lyons.

## Loyola Continues Winning Streak

Jerry Harkness, who has helped bring nationwide fame to Loyola University of Chicago, also is helping himself to some personal glory.

Although Loyola stresses team play and holds down the role of the individual, Harkness is the leading candidate among the undefeated Ramblers for All-America honors this season. He further proved this Tuesday night when he broke two school records while pacing Loyola to an 87-68 victory over Marquette.

It was the 14th triumph in a row for the second-ranked Ramblers, who lead all college basketball teams in total offense.

Harkness poured in 23 points at Milwaukee to break Jack Kerris' school career mark of 1,377 points and his three free throws enabled him to surpass Kerris' record of 585.

**Strong All-Around**

Proud as they are of Harkness, the Ramblers still boast of their all-around strength and point to the fact that quite frequently all five members of the starting unit score in double figures.
