

Undeclared Henley Tops League; Has Top Scorer

Henley's second ranked and undefeated Hornets are presently leading the Rogue River League and big 6-7 center Kent Gooding is the leading scorer in the league with a robust average of 30.7 points per game.

The Hornets are the only unbeaten team in the league with a 4-0 record while Lakeview's surprisingly strong Honkers are tied for second with the defending champion Eagle Point quintet, each with a 3-1 record.

St. Mary's of Medford is fourth with a 2-1 record while Illinois Valley, going into the league competition undefeated, is now 1-2. Phoenix sports a 1-3 record while Sacred Heart and Rogue River are winless in two and four games respectively.

The Hornets hurled a big obstacle last Friday night when they turned on a great fourth quarter finish to spurt to an 87-70 victory over the previously unbeaten Cougars of Illinois Valley. They also used a last period drive the following night to rout Phoenix, 71-54, after leading by only four points with three minutes to play.

The Hornets downed hot-shooting Illinois Valley on a 29-point fourth period spurt. The Hornets held only a four-point lead going into the fourth when they turned on the steam to set a new school scoring record with the 87 points.

There was almost another record. Gooding connected for 40 points in that game by dumping in 15 baskets and 10 of 13 from the line. It was one point shy of his 41-point record last season. He has hit 123 points in four games for the 30.7 average. He leads the second place scorer by 42 points.

Lakeview dumped Phoenix in rather easy style Friday night, 50-36, and then turned tiger Saturday night to hand the Cougars of IV their second straight loss, 54-50. The Honkers' only loss was to Eagle Point, 52-51, in the first league game at Eagle Point. The Honkers have a good scoring combination in Larry Samples and Dan Leahy. They rank third and fourth respectively in league scoring with 101 points between them for 17.5 and 15.3 averages.

Sacred Heart played only one game during the week and dropped it to tough Eagle Point, 61-40. Pete Krok was the only double figure scorer for the Trojans with 10 points. Elmo LeBeau was held to nine but still has a 15.0 average. The Eagles had four in double figures, but Charles Pomeroy, the second leading scorer, was held to only 11. Richard Short popped 16, John Linder 12 and Wilbur Boatwright 10.

Eagle Point also thumped Rogue River Saturday night with Short and Pomeroy again doing the damage. Short had 25 and Pomeroy 23 points and they also had 50 rebounds between them. Tom Davidson topped RR with 18 marks.

Henley leads the scoring with 296 points in four games for a 74.0 average per game. They have allowed 232 points for an average of 57.5. Eagle Point is the second leading scoring team with 246 points and Lakeview the best defensive team with 193 points allowed in four contests for an average of 48.3 per game. They have hit for 224 points and a 56.0 average.

Gooding tops the scorers and his 40 points is the high single game for the season. Pomeroy of Eagle Point is second with 81 points for an average of 20.3. Then comes Samples and Leahy of Lakeview with Short of EP with 60 points and a 15.0 mean. Davidson of RR is next with 53 points and a 13.3 mean. Henley's Mike Beymer and Phoenix's John Granby tied with 52 points and a 13.0 average. Darryl Gellert of IV is ninth with 51 points and a 17.0 average while Henley's Earl Allbritton rounds out the top 10 with 49 points and a 12.3 mean.

WASHING TON (UPI) — The Weather Bureau announced today that it is testing a new rain detection device which could improve river and flood forecasting.

The bureau said the new radar instrument can measure rainfall as far as 100 miles away.

"From a single, convenient location, it will provide instantaneous measurements of precipitation at many points over a broad area," the bureau said in a statement.

It said the new device converts the intensity of radar echoes from 150 points over a river basin into a pattern which can be displayed on a map at a river forecast center.

The agency said the new device would be tested at its radar research laboratory in Norman, Okla.

Wilson, Karras In For Questions

DETROIT (UPI)—Detroit Lions coach George Wilson and All-Pro tackle Alex Karras have been called to New York for questioning by National Football League Commissioner Pete Rozelle concerning Lions players associating with known gamblers.

The Detroit Free Press said today Wilson will cut short his vacation in Delray Beach, Fla., to meet with Rozelle at the league's New York offices. Rozelle will be in Detroit today and Karras was scheduled for a meeting Thursday.

Karras was the first of four Lions players to become involved in the league-wide probe by the commissioner's office. He was plunged into the picture when it was reported the team management was unhappy with his partnership in a Detroit bar.

Detroit Police Commissioner George Edwards added to the fire when he submitted a report, concerning associations of Lions players with known gamblers, to the Lions' management and NFL headquarters.

The report, which named John Gordy, Wayne Walker and Karras as being seen in the company of known gamblers, specified that nothing had been unearthed to indicate criminal activity.

Darris McCord also became involved in the investigation but was not named in Edwards' report.

All four have volunteered to take lie detector tests to prove knowing alleged gamblers did not affect their play.

The Free Press said Walker had been interviewed by Rozelle by telephone several times and would not be called to New York.

In New York, NFL public relations director Jim Kenaal said concerning the meeting, "I'm not saying yes or no. We have decided that we will not disclose any details of the investigation until it is completed. When it is completed we will have a statement."

Tulsa Upsets Wichita Shockers In MV Play

Tulsa University has applied an age-old formula for turning failure into success, and the results are proving better than any one could have expected.

The Oklahoma school has suffered a number of lean years on the basketball court in the last decade, including a disappointing 7-19 mark last season. But holding on to the best of the old, and mixing in a liberal dose of the new, Tulsa is off to what probably will be its best campaign since the mid-50's.

The Hurricanes demonstrated their "new look" for an appreciative audience at Tulsa Tuesday night by battling into two overtime periods with seventh-ranked Wichita and holding on for an 85-83 victory over the powerful Wheatshockers.

It was the seventh triumph against four losses for Tulsa, and by far its most impressive outing of the season. Wichita had gone into the game with an 11-3 record and was considered the most likely candidate (if such a possibility existed) to stop Cincinnati's drive for another Missouri Valley Conference championship.

Aiding the Tulsa cause were a pair of junior college transfer students — Bill Kusleika and Larry Berke. The old stalwarts were Jim King and Gary Hevelone. Kusleika led all scorers with 27 points, including a key foul shot

in the closing moments of the second overtime period. King contributed two field goals in this crucial season and finished his night's work with 18 points. Berke had 16 and Hevelone threw in nine.

Dave Stallworth topped the Wichita marksmen with 25 points, and four of his teammates also hit for double figures.

Iowa State avenged an earlier loss to Drake by beating the Bulldogs, 69-65, in a non-conference contest Tuesday night.

In other games on the light schedule, St. Joseph's of Philadelphia defeated Delaware, 64-57; Buffalo edged Syracuse, 84-81; Cornell toppled Colgate, 84-83; George Washington beat Richmond, 81-71; Bowling Green stopped Kent State, 88-71; William & Mary defeated Virginia Military Institute, 80-71; Idaho turned back Washington State, 72-65, and Duquesne beat Toledo, 67-53.

CHARNLEY BEATS CASON
LONDON (UPI)—European lightweight champion Dave Charnley of London was so pleased today with his victory over Philadelphia's Jethro Cason that he announced:

"I'll not only continue fighting but I'll try to win back the British Empire title from Bunny Grant as soon as possible."

Southpaw Charnley, formerly twice challenger for the world title but still champion of the British Isles and Europe, had considered retiring to his chain of ladies' hair-dressing salons if he lost Tuesday night to American Cason.

But 27-year-old Charnley won impressively over 25-year-old Cason before a sellout crowd of 7,000 at Royal Albert Hall in an excellent 10-round fight.

Referee Jack Hart, the only ring official, had no hesitation in lifting Dave's right hand in victory, to the delight of the cheering fans.

Charnley, weighing 137 to Cason's 138, forced the pace in every round except the seventh.
