Jobless Up In December

SALEM — The number of employed persons in Oregon fell even from November to December although unemployment increased by 3,500. A little over 600,000 workers had jobs in both months, David H. Cameron, commissioner of the State Department of Employment, announced. Employment was up 17,900 from the level of December last year.

The increased unemployment resulted from the layoffs usual at this time of year in lumber and wood products, food products, contract construction, and other minor industries.

Offsetting these job losses were the large numbers of workers needed for the holiday season in retail trade, service, and the post office department.

Compared to last December almost all industries showed employment gains. Contract construction, with unusually favorable working conditions so far, required 6,700 more workers this December. State and local government, the services, finance, retail trade, food products, and plywood and veneer registered other year-to-year employment increases of over 1,000.

Unemployment, at 38,400, was down by 6,090 from the level of last December.

Advertising Man Appointed

NEW YORK (UPI)—Law L. Callaway Jr., former advertising director of Sports Illustrated, has been appointed publisher of Newsweek magazine.

Newsweek president Gibson McCabe, who has been also serving as the publication's publisher, made the announcement Monday. McCabe will retain the post of president and also will assume the chairmanship of the executive committee.

Callaway, 53, previously was advertising director of Fortune magazine and Time International.
