Proposed Increase In Legislator's Pay Still Short Of Many States

SALEM (UPI)—The proposal to pay Oregon legislators \$3,000 a year plus \$20 a day while in session is a big increase over the \$600 a year plus travel allowance that they formerly received.

Other high-paying states include New York, \$7,500 a year; Massachusetts, \$6,700 a year plus an expense allowance; Pennsylvania and Illinois, each \$6,000 per year; Michigan, \$5,900 per year plus a \$1,250 expense allowance; and New Jersey and Ohio, \$3,000 per year.

Lawmakers in Nevada receive \$25 per day for 60 days. California pays legislators \$6,000 a year, plus mileage and \$19 daily while attending sessions.

Some Oregon legislators say privately the proposed \$1,000 a year plus \$20 a day during sessions is too high. Others claim the pay should be higher.

From the legislators' point of view, this is a bad year to have to set their own pay scale.

Oregon faces big money problems and tax increases this session. Many legislators may hesitate to fight for a realistic pay scale because of the state's troubled financial situation.

Two Kennedy Policies Seen Headed For Fracas

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Two negative factors in President Kennedy's annual message directed attention to administration policies that are loaded for trouble.

In a message of 5,500 words, the President devoted time lines to civil rights. But civil rights came out as basic rights in this message. Moreover, the President stopped short—far short—of any civil rights legislation for this session.

The foreign secretary said the crisis in confidence had been fanned by the growth of the Assembly's new and dangerous practice of passing reckless resolutions, notably on colonialism, which revealed an almost total lack of responsibility.
