Supreme Court Affirms Lane County Judgment

SALEM (UPI)—A \$17,000 judgment awarded by Lane County Judge Roland K. Rodman was affirmed today by the Oregon Supreme Court.
 Stuart G. Barrett, 77, Eugene, was killed when struck by a car driven by Cornelia W. Mishler as she was driving out of her driveway.
 The award was made to Edith Barrett Durkoop, administratrix of Barrett's estate.
 The defendant denied negligence. There were no witnesses to the accident. Physical evidence on Barrett's clothing and on the undercarriage of the auto indicated the car had passed over Barrett.
 The Supreme Court said that direct evidence is not required to prove a fact, but it may be established by circumstantial evidence, and in this case the jury could find that the defendant's car passed over the deceased.
 A judgment of involuntary nonsuit against Calvin J. Palmer following an auto crash in Eugene was reversed and remanded for a new trial. Judgment against Palmer was handed down by Lane County Circuit Judge William S. Fort.

Checks Ready For Veterans

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The Veterans Administration said today it has entered the final phase of an accelerated distribution of \$27 million in veterans' insurance dividends.
 Administrator John S. Gleason Jr. said final dividend checks are expected to be mailed out by the first of next week. This would mean that distribution of dividends to five million veterans will have required only four weeks.

Dwindling Fuel Supply Adds To Cold Miseries

LONDON (UPI)—Dwindling fuel supplies today added to Europe's cold wave misery and caused power shortages so severe that London electricity in Buckingham Palace was cut off temporarily.
 The fuel situation was approaching the critical point in some countries.
 A state of emergency was declared in Bulgaria because of devastating snowfalls which have blocked all main road and thoroughfares, Radio Sofia said today.
 The radio said committees are being formed over Bulgaria to clear roads and highways to prevent ground transportation from coming to a complete halt.
 A fuel shortage in many countries threatened to pile new miseries on winter-weary Europeans. Even the British royal family felt the shortages. All electric supplies to Buckingham Palace were cut off for eight minutes today. A spokesman for the London Electricity Board said the "cut was just one of a number we had to make as part of this morning's reduction."
 Princess Anne, 11, was the only member of the family in the palace. Queen Elizabeth and other members of the royal family are at Sandringham Castle.
 It was so cold in London that diesel fuel in 200 buses turned to "jelly" and many runs were cancelled or delayed.
