Goldwater Asks Probe Of Cuba Invasion Try

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Sen. Barry Goldwater, R-Ariz., introduced a resolution today calling for a "full and impartial" investigation of the Bay of Pigs Cuban invasion fiasco.

Goldwater's resolution calls for an inquiry by the Senate Armed Services Committee headed by Sen. Richard Russell, D-Ga.

The Arizona Republican told the Senate that such an investigation was the only means by which the American people would be fully informed about the ill-fated invasion attempt in April, 1961.

He said a congressional investigation became mandatory when Atty. Gen. Robert F. Kennedy recently stated that the U.S. government never planned air cover for the invasion group seeking to topple Fidel Castro.

Morse made the statement after Sen. GOP Leader Everett M. Dirksen, Ill., proposed a Republican inquiry to get the "entire story" historically accurate.

Dirksen made his proposal at a meeting of the Senate GOP Policy Committee, but he did not seek or receive the committee's endorsement of the move.

Ex-Collegian Found Innocent

PORTLAND (UPI) — Royal Kenneth Hayes, 24, former college student, was found innocent of a charge of first degree murder Tuesday by reason of insanity.

He went on trial on a charge of shooting to death Theodore Ross, a security guard at the Journal building, last Feb. 12.

Circuit Judge Alan F. Davis found Hayes innocent and ordered him committed to the State Hospital, following testimony by psychiatrists.
