# TV District Turned Down

DUNSMUIR — A request of the Dunsmuir City Council to approve formation of a southern Siskiyou public utility district to support a television translator system was turned down by the council at Monday night's council meeting.

The Mount Shasta City Council voted to favor formation of the district at its last meeting. The request was made by the Dunsmuir Key Club which has raised funds for the translator installation and sponsored its erection.

At Monday night's meeting, a large delegation of citizens assembled to discuss the proposal. John Burgess, owner of the Dunsmuir Television Cable system, was among the outspoken opponents of the utility district which he said would compete with private enterprise. Burgess' attorney, Ross Bigler of Yreka, also denounced the proposal.

David Otis, attorney for the Key Club, stated council action favoring the district would merely set machinery in motion for a district election whereby the voters would have the final choice. He said most of southern Siskiyou County is not within cable service reach and could not be economically served by a cable system.

In other business, the council accepted \$678.97 for cable franchise renewal.

A resolution was passed opposing partisan political labels by municipal office candidates.

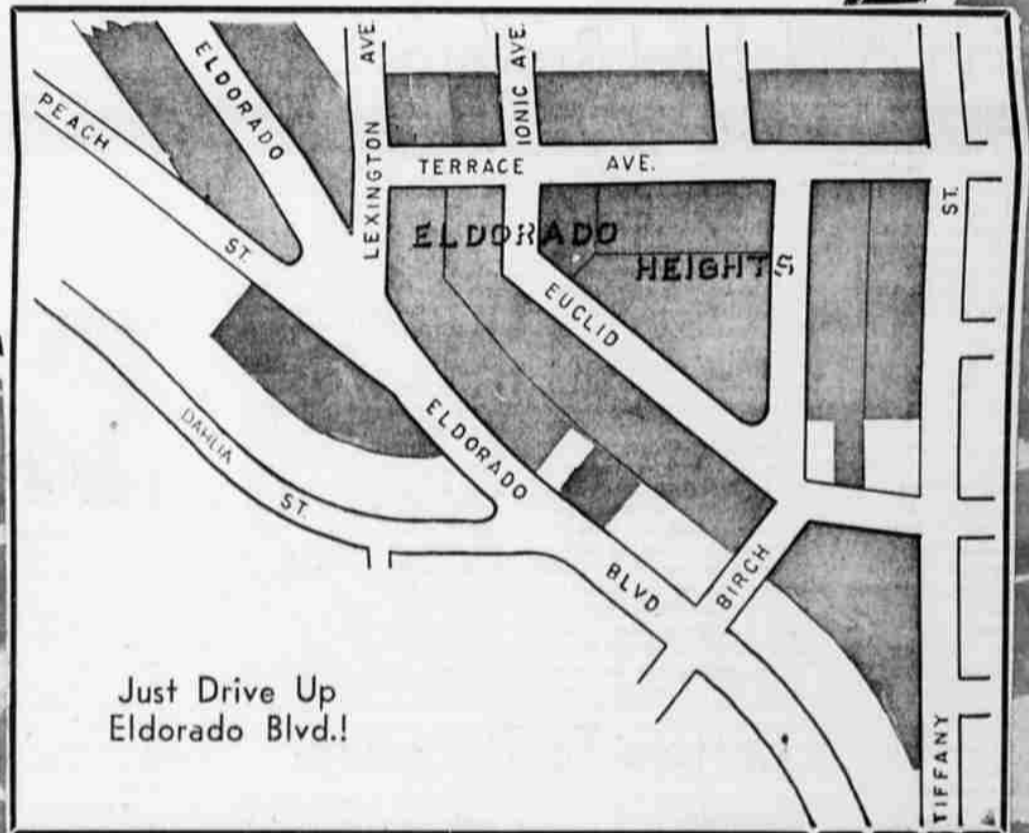
