

Zany Gags Produced For Movie

HOLLYWOOD (UPI) — Movie producer Stanley Kramer has spent \$317,000 on such tomfoolery as a ruined gas station, a fire-works explosion and the chance to dump Phil Silvers in a river.

Kramer is producing the multi-million dollar picture, "It's a Mad, Mad, Mad, Mad World" and he's determined to make it as insane as possible.

To do so, Kramer must invent situations for such clowns as Jimmy Durante, Milton Berle, Sid Caesar, Buddy Hackett, Mickey Rooney, Dick Shawn and Ethel Merman.

Kramer and his script writers get the zany ideas and then dump them into the lap of special effects man Danny Lee. It's up to Lee to figure a way to activate the gags.

Lee and his staff of 20 assistants worked hard and long figuring out how to maneuver an empty automobile one mile down a highway and off a 500-foot cliff.

Uses Remote Control After hours of searching for involved electronic equipment Lee built a do-it-yourself remote control set for the automobile.

When it was time to film the cliff scene Lee stood on a hillside a mile away from the car. Via remote control he started it off the highway and over a cliff.

The scene calling for Phil Silvers' car to sink in a river was complicated by the fact that Phil can't swim.

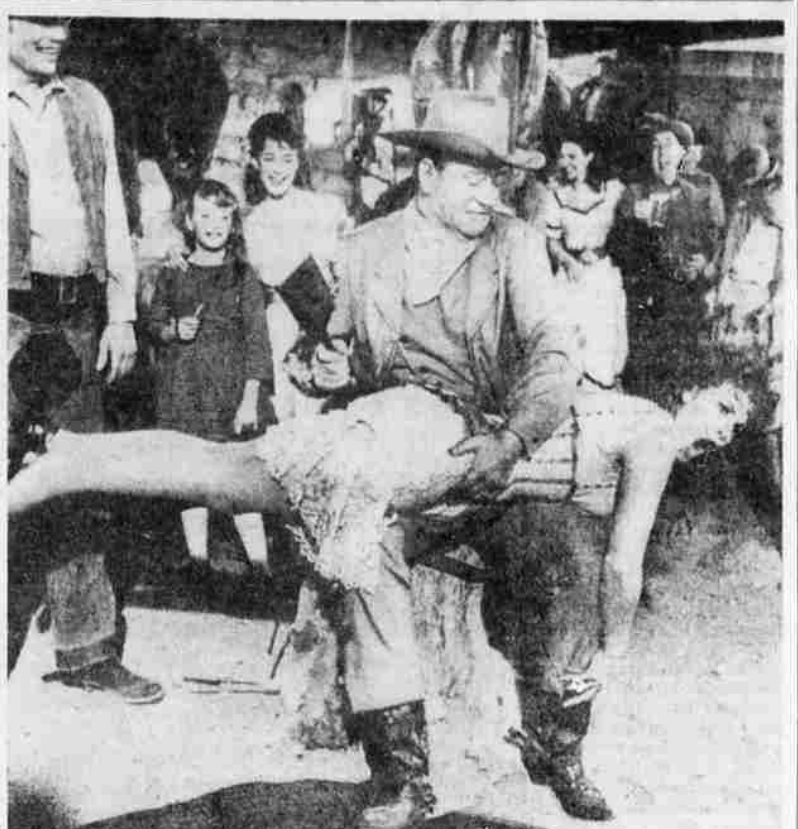
With the use of pulleys, pontoons and life guards for the river, the car was driven into the pool, actually to float away and sink. Sued, it was pulled under the water by cables.

Fireworks For Caesar Other tricks were equally complicated, like the one which placed Sid Caesar and Edie Adams in the middle of a fireworks explosion.

The slapstick atmosphere of the picture is reminiscent of old time comedy. One scene has a gang of actors on a collapsing fire escape while another puts the performers atop a spraying 100-foot fire engine ladder.

One of the zaniest scenes shows a fight between Jonathan Winters and a couple of gas station attendants. Lee had to build the service station so the whole structure would collapse as the three men fought around it.

Lee, a 29-year veteran in special effects work, has been creating "Mad World's" tricks for the past 10 months. And after 217 tricks, he's finally finished.

Pulitzer Prize Winner Happy Over Film Effort

HOLLYWOOD (UPI)—Once a novelist sells his book to the movies he covers himself with sack cloth and ashes and screams like a man struck with the bends.

It is traditional. Movie companies, as authors see it, dismember their novels, rob them of artistic merit and generally frowze up the plot so as to make it unrecognizable.

The only solace they find is in the boxcar it takes to haul away the money from the sale.

Therefore it comes as a distinct shock to find a Pulitzer Prize-winner who is delighted with what the movies have done with one of the best-selling books in recent publishing history.

The author is Harper Lee. The book, "To Kill a Mockingbird," Miss Lee, a southern gal, sat in on a star-studded preview of the screen version of her novel and came away smiling happily.

"It's a fantastically good motion picture," she said at a buffet supper after the screening. "And it remained faithful to the spirit of the book. It was unpretentious. Nothing phony about it."

Miss Lee left off to accept the congratulations of the stars (Rock Hudson, Gregory Peck, Natalie Wood, Paul Newman) and other celebrities who had attended the screening.

"I had one or two doubts about selling the book to films," she said. "But the decision was unemotional and done matter-of-factly."

"When I met Alan Pakula (the producer) I was impressed with him, and then Rob Mulligan (the director) exuded confidence. Both men have excellent taste, and when Horton Foote was signed to write the screenplay I had no misgivings whatever."

"My first reaction to the sale was indifference. After all, I don't write deathless prose."

There are those who would argue that Miss Lee on that point. Her book was described as a great work of art. And the movie promises to be one of the finest of the past decade.

"I'm still surprised about the success of the book," Miss Lee said. "It was my first, you know."

Miss Lee is adamant in denying that any part of "To Kill a Mockingbird" is autobiographical. She is just as definite in her unwillingness to accept the praise of the actors who brought her story to life.

"I thought Gregory Peck was absolutely right for the role of the father as soon as I met him," she said. "I felt the same way about the children (Mary Badham and Phillip Alford). They had never acted before, but in this picture they are simply great."

Informedly unchic in her appreciation of the picture, Miss Lee smiled broadly: "I'm a very satisfied author. Maybe my experience with the movie version of my book will encourage other novelists to expect the same kind of treatment."

NEW YORK (UPI)—"My Unforgettable Teacher" is the subject for a 500-word essay contest for high school students that offers \$9,100 college scholarships valued at \$6,000 each in behalf of the CBS "G-E College Bowl" program entries must be submitted before March 31.
