Bulletin Tells Sewing Secrets

Perfectly matched plaids can be used. The garment will be easier to cut and sew, and will take less material. Patterns with properly joined plaids can ruin the effect of the most expensive fabric.

Secrets of sewing with plaids are told in a new, illustrated bulletin available from Oregon State University extension service.

Size of the plaid makes a difference in the pattern the home seamstress should choose. For example, a large plaid looks best when a pattern with few seams is used.
