Musical Scheduled At Oretch Little Theatre, April 4-5

A housewife, whose favorite pastime is singing and a Kingsley Field airman have been

awarded the leading roles of the all-amateur musical production, "Eliza and the Lumberjack," slated for Thursday and Friday, April 4-5, at the Oregon Technical Institute Little Theatre, according to Mrs. W. D. Miller, director of the musical.

In addition to the lead roles, four other principal parts have been cast and performers for numerous other roles will be named later.

The setting of the musical is a lumber camp at Port Ludlow, Wash., in the late 1800s, when Indians and half-breeds were subjects of scorn in the brawling Western logging camps.

The musical relates the reactions of Eliza to the rustic environment of the Northwest and the even more rustic demeanor of the loggers which is in extreme contrast to the community and people of her native Philadelphia.

Eliza, to be portrayed by Mrs. Gene Favell, finds that despite the continual absence of her husband and the presence of his partner, that love may be a quiet thing even in a howling wilderness.

Unlike the singing role she assumes, Mrs. Favell's talents are more culinary than social. She not only cooks, but is an accomplished homemaker rearing six children from 3 to 12 years of age. Mrs. Favell's acting experience has been in college programs, but she has performed frequently as a singer for numerous local organizations.

Eliza's husband, the brawny lumberjack Thomas Barrett, is being played by Jerry Strickland, a Kingsley Field airman who is a former instrumental soloist and singing soloist for the 23rd Air Division. In addition to having demonstrated the ability to perform the role, Strickland has the physical attributes of a lumberjack. He was awarded a football scholarship to Arlington State Col-

lege, where he changed his major from music to pre-law. The four other feature players include Lorin Miller, assistant principal at Klamath Union High School, as Barrett's partner, the suave but unscrupulous Davis

As the "small town timber wolf" Bullwhacker Joe, Hawley solos and duets with San Francisco Annie. The latter role is taken by sultry-voiced Mrs. Gilbert, a past performer in the Spokane Civic Theatre and the Snohomish

County Little Theatre, but who is known locally as the director of the Klamath Civic Theatre's play, "The Tender Trap."

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Poor Play Causes Set

West's jump to three spades is not recommended as a steady diet. Sometimes, a six card suit headed by the queen runs into too much strength in back of it. This time the bid worked beautifully. North was crowded into making a rather unsound four heart bid and after East tried four spades, South continued to five hearts.

West opened clubs and continued the suit. South ruffed the third lead and drew trumps. Then he went after the diamonds. When that suit broke four-one he had to lose a diamond trick and was down one.

North apologized for his four heart bid. South complained about bad luck and East, who was keeping score, wrote down 100 points on his side instead of the 150 below the line and 500 above the line he would have had to write had South taken time to play the hand properly.

South should have drawn two rounds of trumps. This would have left one trump outstanding. Then he should have gone after the diamond suit.

Should diamonds break three-two he would draw the last trump after playing two rounds of diamonds. Should diamonds break four-one the second diamond might be trumped. In that case South would be able to trump a losing diamond with dummy's remaining trump and still go down one. The way the cards lay South would make his contract. East would have to follow to four diamond leads and South would have trumped his diamond loser, returned to his hand with the ace of spades and won the rubber.

A—If you play your partner's bid as Blackwood bid five hearts to show two aces. Otherwise, pass because you have already shown your full strength.
