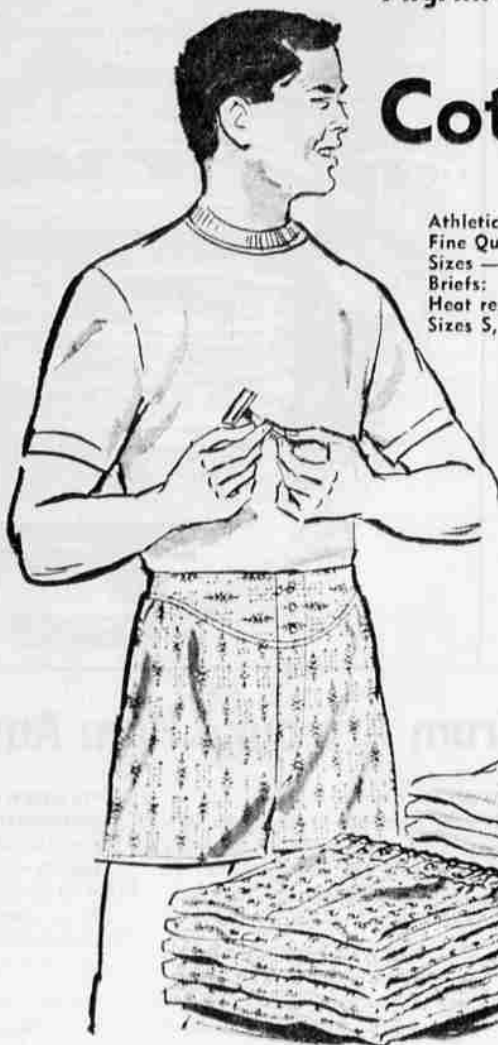

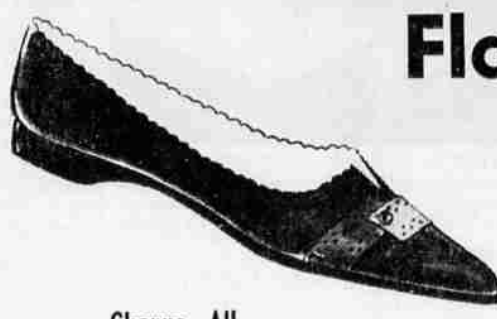

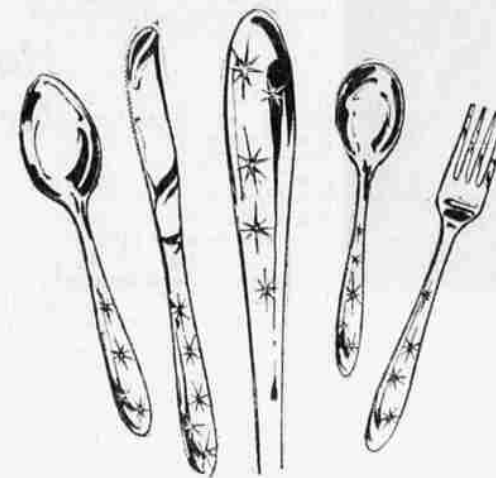

Pit Control Plan Studied

ALTURAS — Long sought-after federal flood control of the Pit River through Alturas is now under study by the Army Corps of Engineers, according to Harold T. "Bizz" Johnson, United States congressman.

The Army Engineers are preparing a reconnaissance report on the flood control problems created by the Pit River in the vicinity of Alturas. A field inspection of the problems that have produced evidence of floods here for the past 90 years initiated the reconnaissance study under the small flood control project.

"I expect to discuss the matter further and in detail with the engineers at a special meeting to be held early in February," Johnson said.

According to Johnson, a reconnaissance report is the first major step toward possible construction of a small flood control project. If the report indicates that an economically feasible project can be developed, a detailed report can be developed.

"A favorable report could serve as the basis for authorization of a project by the chief of engineers," Johnson said. "Although it may appear that the government moves slowly and cautiously in the preparation of its reports before any money is allocated, you can rest assured that just as soon as the detailed report is authorized, construction will begin immediately," he went on.

Just what that construction will be, possibly the rerouting of the Pit River around Alturas, will not be determined until the report is finished.

Gates Open For Seniors

EUGENE—The Chancellor's Office of the Oregon State System of Higher Education has announced that for the second year Oregon high school seniors whose grades average C plus or better will be granted admission to system institutions without waiting for final grades and graduation.

According to Dr. Francis B. Nickerson, assistant to the chancellor, early admissions forms have been mailed to all high school principals in the state. Qualified students should apply for early admission through their principals or guidance counselors. The early admissions plan was first used in 1962 with notable success. Many students were able to begin admission procedures early in the year, thus establishing their admission and permitting more orderly planning and processing on the campuses.
