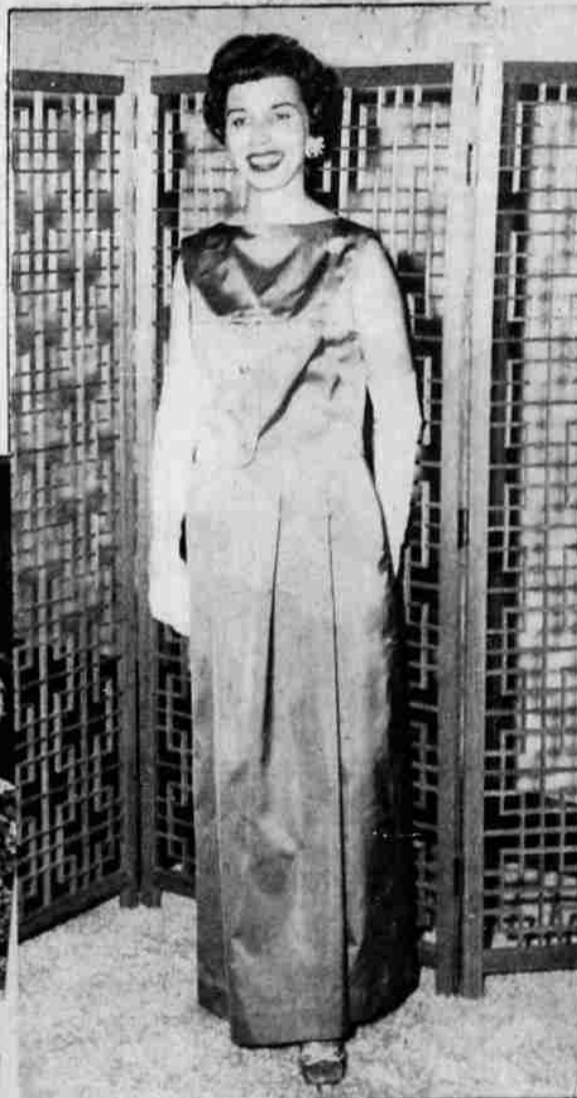
In the new nautical trend, Lucille Poppins, above, fashioned her corduroy pants.
