Owl Wrestlers In Conference Meet Saturday

The Oregon Tech wrestling team left today for Monmouth where they will compete in the Oregon Collegiate Conference Tournament Saturday in an all-day meet.

The preliminaries of the meet begin at 2 p.m., the semifinals at 3 p.m. and the consolation finals and championship finals at 7 p.m. Two mats will be used for all the bouts but the championship finals.

The Owl grapplers go into this important meet as the second choice behind undefeated and very rugged Portland State, the defending champion. The Owls have

unbeaten in nine matches but has a draw to mar that otherwise spotless record. He has pinned two opponents.

Dennis Sather, a freshman from Sweet Home, is undefeated in nine matches and is the only Owl with an unblemished record. He has a pair of pins to his credit.

Hank Isenhart comes in at 137 and has won seven of nine matches this season. He hails from Langlois and was third in the conference last season. He also was state champion in 1961.

Ken Kinnear has a 5-4 record, the worst among the Owls. The 147 pounder comes from David Douglas where he was state runner-up in 1960. He is a sophomore.

John Norton is 7-1 for the season with four pins to his credit. He is a freshman wrestler from Burns and was state runner-up at 141 in 1962. Veri Miller has an 8-1 record in the 157-pound division with three pins in the eight wins.

Ed Appleman is the captain of the team and unbeaten in nine matches although he has one draw. That draw came last week when it won the meet for the Owls over Southern Oregon. He is defending league champion and a sophomore from Molalla. He fights at 177.

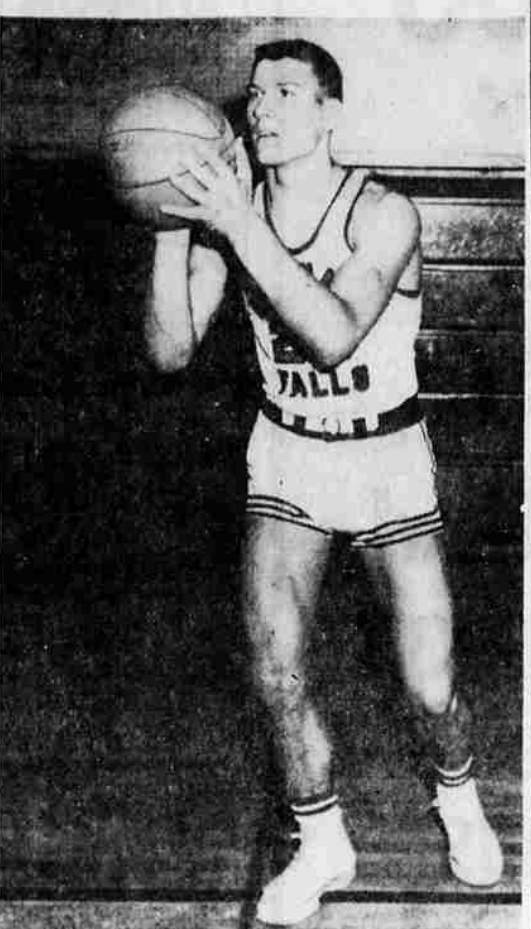

Oregon Tech Five Battles Sprague River Tonight

The Oregon Tech Owls, on the verge of pulling down their third consecutive Oregon Collegiate Conference crown, take a breather this week and have only a non-conference game slated tonight at the Mile High gym against the Sprague River Ducks, National Indian champions.

Tickets for the game are on sale at the Eagle Cafe. The Ducks have 500 tickets which they are selling. The two teams will split the ticket sales. All tickets go at 50 cents each.

The Owls are sporting a 17-5 season record and have lost only one of the last 13 encounters and that one in overtime. The Ducks, preparing for the National Indian Tournament again and in defense of it, now hold an 18-3 mark.

Coach Jim Partlow's charges are hitting the basket at an average of 75.5 points per game for the season and the Ducks have averaged 73 points per game in 21 games. The Owls, however, have been against a somewhat tougher competition.

The Owls, led by the "Iron Man Five," with Sammy Smith and Willie Anderson heading the group, will be favored to send the Ducks to their fourth defeat of the season. This game replaces Idaho Tech on OTT's original schedule. Idaho Tech, a new school, dropped the sport.

The Ducks have some fine players and are led by 6-6 DeMerle Lytle who was the most valuable player in the Yakima Indian and Hoopa Indian tournaments last year. He is averaging 31 points per game this season. The other four starters to join him probably will be Don Dexter (18.0), Bob David (14.0), Chuck Ruff (12.0) and Butch Crane. Crane just joined the team recently.

Sprague River will be bolstered at the end of the Oregon Tech season because the Owls' fine forward Norm Johns will join the Ducks for the Indian Tournament. Others for the Ducks are Allan LaPlante, Pat Barney, Bert Lawver, Mo Jimenez and Bob Barney.

The five starters for Oregon Tech will be Smith, Anderson, Johns, Hewlett, Nash and Van Zitek. All five OTT starters are averaging over 10 points per game. Smith is hitting at a 22.0 clip per game. Anderson at 18.9, Nash at 14.0 per game, Zitek at 13.9 and Johns at 10.5.

The Owls have hit over 100 points in their last two games and could again against the Ducks. But Partlow likely will try to get some of his reserves into the game for some game experience. Those likely to see action are Ron Wilkerson, Chuck Hawkins, Wayne Dennis and Chuck Nagley.

The Wolves, who are in second place in the conference with a 7-4 record, meet Eastern Oregon at La Grande in the opener of a two-game series. A loss would eliminate them from a title chance.

Portland State faces Southern Oregon at Ashland in another two-game series. Oregon Tech, which has clinched a tie for its third straight championship with a 12-1 mark, is idle.

They will be going against a rough team in Grants Pass. The Cavemen are led by Jim Pippin who has 174 points and an 11.6 average for the season. Al Hutchins, however, has been the big gun of late. The Owls could do well in this tournament if Owl Coach Howard Morris is hoping that his wrestlers don't have the bad luck draw and get matched with the Portland State boys right off the bat. But they could get some tough individual matches from other schools such as Southern Oregon.

The Mile High team will be going into this tournament with an excellent record of 53 victories, 18 losses and three draws for the 10 matches this season. Nineteen of those 53 victories have come by the pin route.
