Klamath Wrestlers Enter District Mat Tournament

The Klamath Union wrestling team will be in Medford tonight and Saturday to compete in the Southern Oregon Conference Wrestling Tournament which determines the wrestlers who will go to the state tournament.

Coach Delance Duncan is taking 25 grapplers to the tournament with hopes of dethroning the defending champion Grants Pass team which has dealt the Pelicans so much misery this season. The Pelicans are 9-2-1 for the season in dual matches and both those losses were to the rugged Gavenmen of Grants Pass. The loss was suffered to Medford, 20-20, after the Pelicans had won easily in the first meeting.

The Pelicans were second be-

hind the Gavenmen in the David Douglas and Grants Pass tournaments and the Whitebirds won the Roseburg tournament.

Coach Duncan also has some fine individuals with records. This includes Tom Miles at the 135-pound event and he undoubtedly will be the favorite for that championship. He has a 17-0 record for the season which includes the Pelicans' only victory against the touring Japanese National All-Star team. He also has eight pins.

Grant Humphrey, at 123, has the second best record of 15-1. He is figured to be a contender for the 115-pound title. Ron Hitehook has the third best mark on the team. The 137-pounder has a 14-2-1

record. He also will be among the favorites.

Then comes heavyweight Thurston Henzel who has an 11-4-2 mark with six pins to his credit. He will be in a tough class but figures to hold his own with the others. He also could be a contender.

Jim McClung, at 115, will be getting back into action with a 10-1-1 record. He has missed the past three or four duals because of an injury but is ready to go now. At his best, he will be among the best in the tournament. Bob Ewing, at 191, has an 11-1 record and also has been on the injured list but is back in shape now and should be among the top men in the 191-pound class.

These boys, along with Mike Christy, Dave Davis, John Stillwell, Ron Head, Terry Christiansen, Bob Daulton and Kent Puckett, make up the first unit. Six of the 13 are seniors and the remaining seven are juniors.

The second unit will have only 12 wrestlers, minus the 96-pound weight. They are Mike Spiker, Gary Hawkins, Gary Wishart, Rich Bath, Rich MacBeth, Larry Tice, Paul Wilson, Ben Gonzales, Andy Maritsak, Dave Coulson, Gordon Ward and Bill Mills. There are two sophomores on this unit in Spiker and Martusak.

The top two places from the meet this weekend in Medford will gain berths in the state tournament in Corvallis the next weekend, March 1-2. The Pelicans should show well.

OCE's Wolves finished second behind the Owls and got the berth to the NAIA small college playoffs, probably against Lewis and Clark, because of the ineligibility of the Owls. They are not classified as a four-year school yet and can't take part in post season tournaments.

This, despite being a heart-breaking thing for the coach, players and school, hasn't dampened the Owls' enthusiasm to win any. They had the OCC title all wrapped up Tuesday night when they went to Ashland but proceeded to trounce the Red Raiders for the 12th straight time, 111-93. It was the third time in a row the Owls had gone over the century mark, also.

The Owls will be taking on the "mighty midgets" of OCE in their last two games of the season. The Owls will be looking for their 10th and 20th victories of the year against six losses. They lost only one conference game and that in an overtime to Portland State.

The game won't be an easy one against the Wolves, a hot-shooting unit and especially so on their home court. The Owls could drop one of the two there but they will be shooting for the best season possible. They had a 20-6 season last year and could match that this season.

Coach Jim Partlow will have his usual "Iron-Man Five" as the starting unit. And this five is as good as any in this region. The five starters will be Sam Smith, Willie Anderson, Hewlett Nason, Norm Johns and Van Zitek. Others who could see action if some of the Owls foul out or get far enough ahead are Wayne Denas, Ron Wilkerson, Dick Johnson, Chuck Nagley and Chuck Hawkins.

Smith can break his own league scoring record with two 20-0 games. He is 58 points shy of his last year's record of 321 points. He has 283 through 14 games to lead the league. Anderson fell down to fourth spot but that didn't include the Tuesday game in which he nailed down 35 points.

Some of the league statistics below are not complete but will be completed by the league statstician after this week's final schedule and will be published next week sometime, possibly Sunday.
