Right Play Gets Trick

Study the bidding, then look at the East hand only. Your partner opens the four of diamonds against South's three no-trump contract. If South would be generous enough to play dummy's jack you would have no problem, but South plays the six.

Should you go up with the king or should you play the eight?

The first step in your reasoning should be to count a few points. Dummy has eight. You have 11. Probably South has 17 since he rebid to three no-trump. That leaves exactly four points for your partner. Some of those points will be in diamonds since he probably has led from something. If he has the queen of diamonds and another queen, a little study will show that you aren't likely to beat the hand under any circumstances.

Suppose West holds the ace of diamonds? If he also holds the ten, you can play the king and return the eight after the king holds. Then if your partner ducks you will get in with one of your aces and give him two diamond tricks. You note that the eight spot play will be equally effective in this case.

Suppose he holds ace-nine of diamonds. If you play the king declarer will have two diamond stoppers. Suppose you play the eight? Declarer will win with the queen or ten. You will gain the lead with an ace and lay down the king of diamonds to drop North's jack. Then a third diamond lead will make your partner's king and nine both good so the eight spot is your correct play.

Tax Date Reminded

A tax return due date reminder for Oregon businesses was issued today by A. G. Erickson, director of the Internal Revenue Service for Oregon.

Erickson said Feb. 28 is the date by which all businesses must file annual information returns showing payments made during 1962 of salaries, wages, fees, commissions, and other compensation for personal services totaling \$500 or more.

Payments of interest, rents, royalties, annuities, pensions and other income must be reported, he said, as well as dividends of \$10 or more.

However, compensation already reported on Forms W-2 is not included on these information returns.

Director Erickson said filers of information returns should use forms 1099 and 1006.

He said Feb. 28 is also the deadline for manufacturers, retailers and others liable for more than \$100 in excise taxes for the month of January to deposit the taxes in a depository. Those making deposits of excise taxes should use Form 337.

Dunsmuir Asked To Assume Park, Museum Obligations

DUNSMUIR — The Dunsmuir City Council has been asked to take over the railroad park and museum development south of the city in order for the project to qualify for an Area Redevelopment grant of \$350,000.

At the council meeting Monday night, Carl Clement, director of the Siskiyou Recreation Development League, a non-profit corporation sponsoring construction of the park and museum, stated his corporation could not qualify for a grant as it is not a public agency.

The league can qualify for an

ARA commercial loan with less desirable terms, Clement said. The league is now seeking a \$309,000 ARA loan plus a \$350,000 grant to complete a 50-acre recreational development which will include a full-sized operating railroad, swimming pool, and entertainment concessions.

Howard Jones, city attorney, explained the city would have to back a revenue bond to serve as ARA loan collateral. If it took the project over, Clement said the league would deed the city the development and then complete the project on a lease basis. The

league lists its current assets, primarily donations of equipment and museum items, as \$336,000.

The council took the proposal under consideration.

In other business, the council recommended Siskiyou Avenue be rezoned for limited commercial use and the hillside property at its northern limits be zoned to permit outdoor advertising. The property owners present for a public zoning hearing stated Siskiyou Avenue, adjacent to Highway 99 freeway, is increasing in commercial value. It is now primarily residential.

The council also endorsed the highway users tax proposal now slated for consideration in the state senate.

A letter will be written by the council asking for joint use by the city of a forest service ranger station in north Dunsmuir. The building is now used for issuing fire permits and distributing forest service information during the summer months. The city hopes to use it as a public information center.

Rail Passenger Traffic Down

SALEM (UPI) — Passenger traffic on Southern Pacific trains in Oregon has been declining steadily, an officer of the railroad told a state public utility examiner Wednesday.

Henry E. Mogler of SP's San Francisco office asked the PUC to lift the suspension of a 10 per cent across-the-board increase on intrastate fares. He said the increase was needed to offset losses in carrying passengers.

Mogler said annual passenger traffic has dropped from 24,000 in 1960 to 18,000 in recent years.
