

Girl Dies Of Hammer Beating In Utah Desert

SALT LAKE CITY (UPI) — An 18-year-old Salt Lake City girl died in a local hospital Saturday of severe head injuries inflicted by a hammer-wielding assailant.

The victim, Carole Annette Clayton, had been in critical condition since she and her roommate, Dorinda Atnes, 18, were bludgeoned in a desolate area near Great Salt Lake Wednesday.

Miss Atnes, a Utah 1962 National Merit Scholar finalist, remained in serious condition in another hospital.

The youth charged in connection with the beatings, 17-year-old Rex Hintze of Salt Lake City, was taken back into custody after the girl's death on a complaint of first degree murder.

Hintze who had been free on \$5,000 bond on a lesser charge of assault with intent to commit murder, was to be arraigned before Third District Judge Joseph P. Jeppson on the murder charge.

Hintze, who was arrested near the spot where the two girls were beaten and buried alive in a makeshift grave, told officers he "got furious" and beat the girls because they "wouldn't help us get the car unstuck."

The girls were attacked after a car occupied by them, Hintze and a companion, Tony Robertson, 19, became mired in mud on a dirt road 14 miles north of Delta.

Robertson, who was not involved in the beatings, hiked 14 miles to notify authorities when he learned what had happened to the girls.

Blasts Ruin Space Bag

PALESTINE, Tex. (UPI) — A series of blasts ruined a \$9,000 giant unmanned space exploration balloon Friday and scientists said it will be at least another week before another one can be obtained.

The blast happened while the balloon was being inflated with helium gas for a trip above the earth's atmosphere to study Mars. No one was injured.

For once the weather was right for the launching and the 80-foot-by-60-foot balloon was about half filled with helium when a tear developed. Princeton University scientists were trying to determine if it could be patched when it ripped wide open with a series of sharp, popping sounds that sounded like mortar fire.

The polyester fiber shell ruptured. Scientists said extreme gas pressure caused the bag to burst. No fire broke out because helium is non-inflammable.

The accident was particularly frustrating to the scientists who had to postpone launchings 14 times because of the weather.

There was no damage to the 36-inch telescopic eye that was to get an unrestricted look at Mars from beyond the haze of the earth's atmosphere. A close-up study of Mars would give scientists information on whether it could support life.
