School Course Is Evaluated

The Klamath Falls Branch of the American Association of University Women Higher Education Study Group recently participated in an AAUW evaluation of a proposed public school course. The evaluation of the course, "Democracy versus Communism" was made at the request of the Oregon State Department of Education. The resulting critique which combined suggestions from the 26 Oregon branches was commend-

ed by both the governor and the department. The report submitted to the Department of Education stated that the course as presented was too mature for the students and that while fairness to communism was accorded, course material must not apologize for democracy. Branches suggested books to be added to the course bibliography, special teacher training, and close correlation with current events.
