Owl Cagers, Wrestlers Honored With Banquet

Oregon Tech's basketball and wrestling teams were honored in the Winema Hotel Banquet Room Tuesday night by the coaches, fans and press of Klamath Falls. Awards were presented to players and wrestlers during the ceremonies. Basketball awards went to "Sweet" Sammy Smith as the Most Outstanding Player, to Hewlett Nash as the Most Inspirational Player and to Van Zitek as the Best Defensive Player.

Wrestling awards were given to Milo Crumrine of Klamath Falls as the Most Outstanding Wrestler, to Hank Isenhart as the Most Inspirational Wrestler and to captain Ed Appleman.

There were about 150 attending the banquet honoring what is said to be the finest Oregon Tech basketball team in history and possibly the best in Oregon Collegiate Conference history. The Owls won the league title for the third consecutive time and established new records all around in doing it.

They set the best win-loss record a team has ever compiled in winning the crown with a 15-1 record. They scored more points than any team ever had before, averaging better than 15 points more

per game than the previous record, and had the new individual scoring champion in Smith.

Smith broke his own record, set last year, to splinters as he tallied 262 points in 16 games for a 22.6 average. He held the old record of 320 points in league play. He also has been the leading rebounder for the past two years but was nosed out by three by teammate Willie Anderson this year, 237-234.

Coach Jim Partlow, praising his unit highly, and deservedly so, said that he had looked up the records and that Smith was the 17th leading scorer among the nation's small college players which includes over 400 small college schools which play and each have 10-15 players. He also noted that the Owls' scoring average in league (66.4) was 14th in the nation.

There were no guest speakers for the meeting but none was needed because Coach Partlow and wrestling coach Howard Morris spoke of their fine athletes and no one knew them better or could better describe them and their own feelings toward the boys.

The Most Outstanding Wrestler award was copied by Crumrine. He was undefeated in dual match competition this season and won his second straight OCC 115-pound title. He also is defending Far Western AAU 115-pound champ and will defend that title the second weekend in March.

Hank Isenhart was noted as the Most Inspirational Wrestler. He was not undefeated but his inspiration and desire won the honor for him. Appleman received a trophy for being the team captain. Hewlett Nash got the Most In-

spirational Trophy for basketball for the second straight year. It was Hewlett's desire to win and leadership from his guard position which kept the Owls moving during the games.

Van Zitek was voted top defensive player. His quick hands out front time and again knocked the ball away from opposing players and kept them off guard during him as the "fastest hands in the West."
