THE OWL HOOTS

Editor's Note: Guest writer of the Owl Hoots column this week is Professor George Miller, acting head of the Allied Arts and Sciences Division.

The Allied Arts and Sciences Division at Oregon Tech has no major curriculum of its own, but acts as a service division to the various curricula of the school. It teaches the mathematics, physical sciences, English, general business, and humanities requirements of these areas.

In 1953, the Department of Allied and Elective Subjects was formed within the School of Industrial Education. At this time there were four instructors offering eight different courses. In 1957, the department was retitled as Allied Arts and Sciences and given status as a separate school. Division status was granted in 1959. The Allied Division has since grown to 18 instructors offering 54 different courses.

The objectives of this division are: To offer a program of courses that enables the student to achieve greater success in his technical training; to correlate instruction and course content with that of the various technical divisions; and to improve the curriculum continuously to meet the standards of higher education and the changing needs of industry.

The American Society for Engineering Education in 1962 published a report on the Characteristics of Excellence in Engineering Technical Education. This report basically confirms what has been taking place at Oregon Tech since 1953 when the Engineering Division decided it would be to the best interests of the students if Allied were to teach the math and science requirements for engineering.

This report states that both math and physical sciences should be taught at college level in courses separate from the technical area and so arranged that the principles be taught prior to the time they are needed in the technical courses. The Allied Division meets the requirements set in this report by offering a full academic year of physical sciences and the necessary math. The committee making this report recommends nine quarter hours of English. Every curriculum at Oregon Tech meets this requirement. Allied Division teaches these courses, placing special emphasis on written communication. Technical report writing is one of the most valuable subjects a student can take. Non-technical studies dealing with supervision, human relations, industrial

organization, psychology, and economics are recommended by the committee. These courses are taught by the Allied Division and are available to all students on an elective or required basis.

Since last fall, a research project has been undertaken to evaluate the Allied Arts and Sciences Division. The various recruiting teams from industry that visit the Oregon Tech campus have been asked how valuable are the courses taught by the Allied Division in the placement and advancement of the Oregon Tech graduates in industry.

They report that the more math and science a student takes, the better are his chances. Very few people in industry can write bullet-

ins, memos and reports so that others can understand what is written. "Concentrate on writing," they comment. "Since most people lose their jobs because they can't get along with their fellow workers, it is necessary to stress human relations in college work," is another typical comment.

The Allied Arts and Sciences Division at Oregon Tech can and is teaching the courses desired by industry and our accrediting associations. The faculty is well prepared and versatile so that it can correlate the technical need and uses of the Allied courses with the students' major curriculum.

French Query Suspects

PARIS (UPI) — French security forces Friday questioned nine men reportedly involved in plots to kill Premier Georges Pompidou and attack Sante Prison to release other accused terrorists. Naval English Georges Buscia, 28, and eight other men were rounded up last Friday after a raid on a Paris apartment, police revealed Thursday night. Police said Buscia and his gang planned to kill Pompidou with a shower of grenades as he left Army Organization (OAS) to kill church Sunday near his country home. Gaullist Interior Minister Roger Frey, one of his assistants and a French army colonel associated with Frey also were on a "death list," police said. "We were ordered to kill those who led the fight against the OAS," police quoted Buscia as saying.
