

## Subdivision Hearing Set For Mar. 29

A public hearing concerning an amendment to County Subdivision Ordinance No. 1 has been scheduled to begin 10:30 a.m., March 29, in the hearing room of the County Court, according to County Clerk Charles DeLap. The proposed amendment is directed at Section 2, scope of regulations.

The amendment would require that land classified for reforestation be first reclassified before it is subdivided, thereby placing it on the county tax rolls. Planting and other work on such subdivisions costs the county about \$1.50 per acre. Under the present ordinance, the county has no means of collecting this cost until the land is declassified, at the request of the subdivider, by the U.S. Forester, according to Ken Blackman, county planning consultant.

Such action is sometimes not taken until long after a subdivision is developed, Blackman added.

The proposed amendment would permit the county to be reimbursed for its costs within a reasonable time after the subdivision work proceeds.

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Three pickets from New York City paraded in front of the White House today with placards demanding presidential support for a campaign to put clothing on all animals.

They said the first lady should take the lead by putting clothes on her horse when she goes riding.

The pickets, representing the "Society for Indecent to Naked Animals," drew laughs and smiles from passersby. The pickets insisted they were on a serious mission, however.

One placard said, "Mrs. Kennedy, won't you please clothe your horses for decency." Another said, "Mr. President, the indecency of naked animals can be corrected through new federal laws and SINA."

The leader of the group was Bruce Spencer, 33, who said he is a vice president of the SINA Foundation which has headquarters in New York City.

## 4-H Motto Stressed During Nationwide Observance

"Make the Best Better," the motto of the 4-H club program is being stressed by Klamath County 4-Hers this week as they observe National 4-H Club Week. Over 800 members and 125 adult volunteer leaders in Klamath County are participating in the coast-to-coast emphasis on 4-H accomplishments and achievements of the past year.

The 4-H program, a part of the Cooperative Extension Service, is free to youth 9 to 21 years old and is based on a four-fold emphasis of Head, Heart, Hands and Health.

4-H club members who complete project work are eligible for honors awards, scholarships and premiums in recognition of their accomplishments. A 4-H award program exists on the county, state and national level to motivate self-improvement of the individual by providing satisfactions, recognition, and a feeling of belonging for all participating club members.

Club work helps 4-H boys and girls achieve and be recognized for his or her own individual worth and ability. The 4-H program is set up to help club members acquire knowledge, skills, and initiative characteristics.

In recognition of completed 4-H club work, 4-H pins are provided to club members for the first, third and fifth years of club work. Special 4-H keys in the form of a tie clasp for boys and a necklace for girls are awarded for ten years of completed membership.

Other years of completed membership are acknowledged by special 4-H cards. Leaders also receive pins and cards respective of their years of 4-H leadership. For participation in county and state fairs, 4-H club members receive pins indicative of their achievement and premiums representative of their achievements in Klamath County. Fair premiums are awarded in the form of partial or full scholarships to 4-H Camp and 4-H Summer School.

As a part of the national observance program, county medals are provided to club members who demonstrate outstanding accomplishment in their project areas. These county winners are submitted for consideration of state awards in various project areas. These special awards are in the form of membership trophies, gift certificates, trips and merchandise gifts.
