

Judge Ups High Cost Of Cab Ride

A four-mile ride in a taxi cab has cost Alvin Jackson, 24, a total of \$100, it developed in Klamath County Circuit Court Wednesday morning.

The amount was in the form of a fine imposed upon Jackson by Judge David L. Vandenberg in court Wednesday after the former had entered a plea of guilty earlier this week to taking and using a taxi cab without the consent of the owner.

In another court matter, Judge Vandenberg also extended the probation of Linda J. David, 22, for a period of three years, upon the recommendation of the defendant's attorney.

The district attorney's office did not oppose the extension of probation. Miss David had been placed on three years' probation Jan. 6, 1961 after she entered a plea of guilty to complicity in the theft of \$80 from a Klamath Falls man. That probation was revoked by Judge Vandenberg last Friday after it became established that Miss David had been arrested for disorderly conduct last Jan. 23.

In the case against Jackson, Judge Vandenberg pronounced the minimum fine and no jail sentence upon the defendant on the recommendation of the defense attorney and deputy district attorney Bob Thomas.

The defense attorney told the judge that Jackson stepped into the back seat of the taxi last Dec. 19 and waited for the cab driver to return. Several moments later when the driver failed to appear, Jackson moved up to the front seat and, on an impulse, drove off in the cab and parked it in front of his mother's home at 1700 Carlson Drive.

Jackson related the story to his mother, who ordered him to return the taxi to the cab stand. The defendant was apprehended by state police while on route to South and Main Street and lodged in the city jail, the attorney related.

The defense attorney stated that Jackson had been drinking infrequently during the evening prior to the cab borrowing incident.

Bill Aims At Scandal

SALEM (UPI)—A bill aimed at preventing further military scandals such as that at Camp Whittcomb was introduced in the house today by the Committee on Military Affairs.

It would provide for appointment by the governor of an inspector general from the Army National Guard and one from the Air Force National Guard.

The inspectors general would be available to handle signs or complaints of improper conduct or irregularities.

They would have to be at least lieutenant colonels with six years service on the Oregon National Guard or reserve. The governor could appoint additional inspectors general if necessary.

The state's liability is estimated at some \$40,000 in the wake of a scandal that was discovered last year under the administration of the late Adjutant General Alfred E. Hartz.

The House today passed a budget for the State Marine Board. A bill to require new cars to be equipped with seat belts was approved for passage by the House State and Federal Affairs Committee and sent to the floor.

By unanimous vote, the committee killed a bill that would have banned speakers such as Communists, G.I. Hall, from appearing on state college campuses or in public buildings.

The committee approved bills prohibiting racial discrimination in apprenticeship, and allowing public employees leaves of absence to serve in the Peace Corps.

Two bills by Sen. Vern Cook, D-Gresham, would permit voter registrars to conduct door to door canvasses to secure registrations, and would require open meetings for all public agencies.

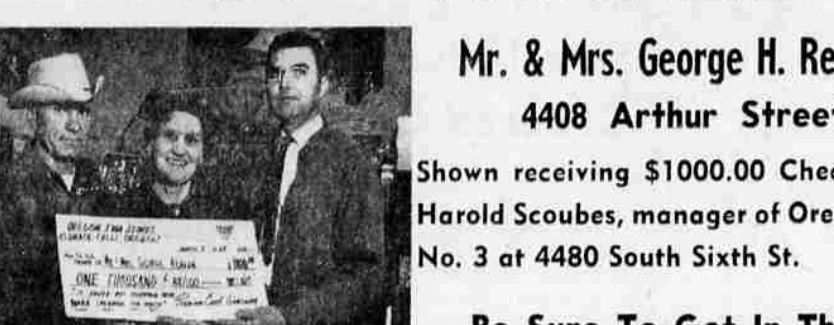
