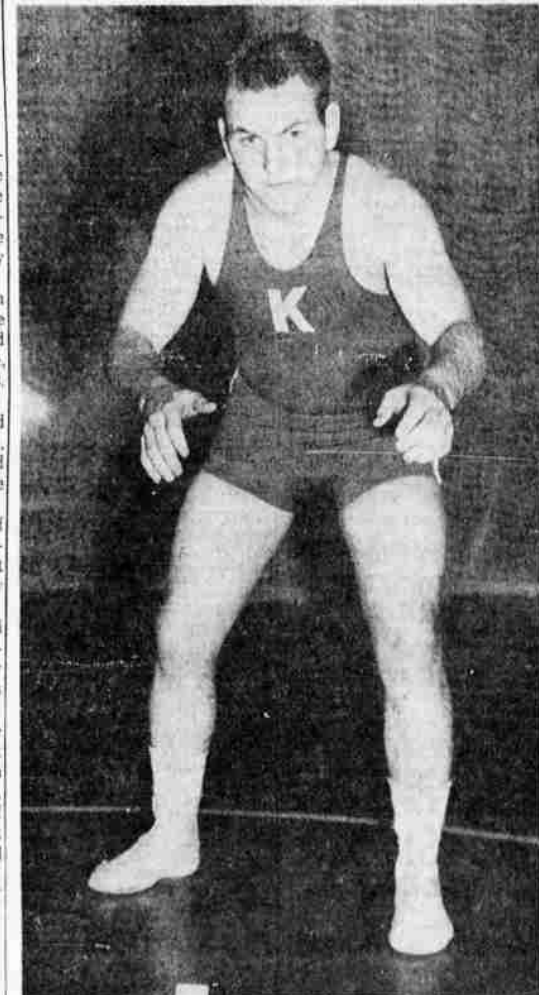

PORTLAND — Sam Smith, Oregon Tech's two-time All-Oregon Collegiate Conference center, captured his third consecutive conference scoring record with 300 points over the 16-game OCC season, according to final statistics released today. Smith, however, did not break the OCC record for a single season set in 1956 by Ted Schadewitz of Eastern Oregon at 389. Smith's three-year total of 977 bettered Schadewitz' 1954-56 mark of 937 by 40 points.
