Jobless Jump Jars Federal Economists

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Government economists were concerned today about the jarring increase in unemployment last month, but emphasized that it did not mean a recession is in the wind.

The consensus was that the sudden rises in unemployment in the past have not always meant that business was in for bad times. It is one of those flighty economic indicators that frequently puzzle forecasters.

However, there is no doubt that this one has them worried not only because of the size of the jump but because of its timing.

The Labor Department sent the chart watchers to their record books Thursday when it announced that the seasonally adjusted rate of unemployment was 6.1 per cent of the labor force.

This was the highest in 15 months.

The development had an added impact because this month business equals the recovery period of the last recession. Economists felt that if something were going to happen, it might be now.

President Kennedy earlier this year forecast a moderate business expansion in 1963. Administration economists said today they saw no reason to change this.

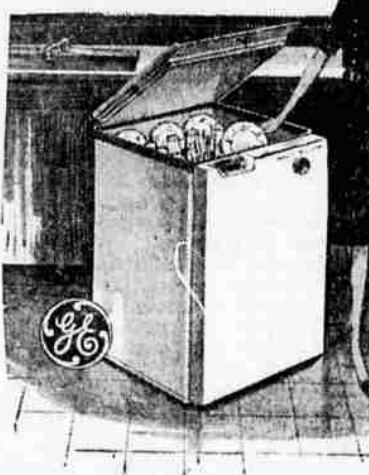

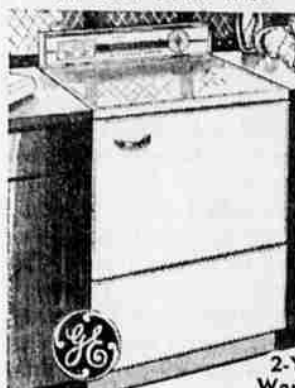

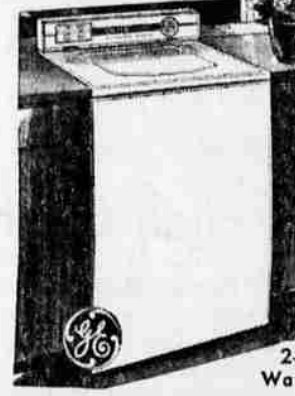
