

Luce Asks More Dams For River

PORTLAND (UPI) — Bonneville Power Administrator Charles F. Luce today called for more storage dams on the Columbia River. He particularly urged early construction of Knowles Dam and reservoir on western Montana's Flathead River.

Luce addressed the Columbia basin Inter-Agency Committee here.

The BPA chief said there were too few storage projects in the Columbia River system in relation to "run-of-the-river" dams. The result, he said, is that "run-of-the-river" dams produce great quantities of secondary, or seasonal, power.

With adequate storage, he said, much of this secondary power could be turned into firm power, or "that which can be guaranteed for delivery day-in and day-out."

Luce said Knowles Dam could provide 250,000 kilowatts of power at the site, and that its storage could increase generation of downstream projects by 700,000 firm kilowatts.

Luce said firm power is the amount that can be produced in the lowest streamflow of record, called the "critical water year," which happened in 1936-37.

Secondary, or seasonal, power can be produced to the extent that streamflow is greater than critical," he said. "But it cannot be guaranteed."

Musa's Tax Views Rapped

SALEM (UPI) — A blistering attack on Senate President Ben Musa's tax views was issued today by Rep. Victor Atiyeh, R-Portland, sponsor of Gov. Mark Hatfield's tax bill.

Musa said Tuesday that Oregon's income tax should be a fixed percentage of the federal income tax for the sake of simplicity.

Atiyeh termed Musa's statement an "eleventh hour desperation pronouncement" that "contributes nothing but discord to the working relations of the two tax committees."

Musa, when advised of Atiyeh's attack, said "it's unfortunate he didn't talk to me about it." Musa said that when he made the suggestion he said it might be the way to collect taxes, but he did not call for such action at this time.

The Portland Republican charged Musa was attempting to "promote himself..." at the expense of both parties who have worked long hours on the serious problem of taxation.

Atiyeh said Musa's statement had contributed to a delay in the session and "confusion on compromise which are being affected through the cooperative attitude of House Speaker Clarence Burton and Tax Committee Chairman Richard Eymann."

Atiyeh charged "the Senate president has violated every ethic in the book" and said it was "deceit" for Musa to call for one tax program in his legislation and another in his public utterances.

China Asks Nikita Visit

MOSCOW (UPI) — Communist China has invited Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev to visit Peking in an effort to heal the ideological rift between the two countries, the official Tass news agency said tonight.

The invitation came in an exchange of letters between Russia and Red China in which the two Communist giants agreed to a Sino-Soviet meeting to settle their differences, Tass said.

The Chinese letter urged Khrushchev to stop off in Peking during his forthcoming trip to Cambodia for "an exchange of views."

"A Cambodian embassy spokesman in London said that Khrushchev had accepted an invitation to visit Cambodia during a tour of North Viet Nam and Burma, but that no date had been set for the visit."

An invitation to Khrushchev was first suggested by Chinese Communist Party leader Mao Tse-tung in talks with the Soviet Ambassador to Peking, according to the New China News Agency which also released the letter in a Peking dispatch monitored in London.

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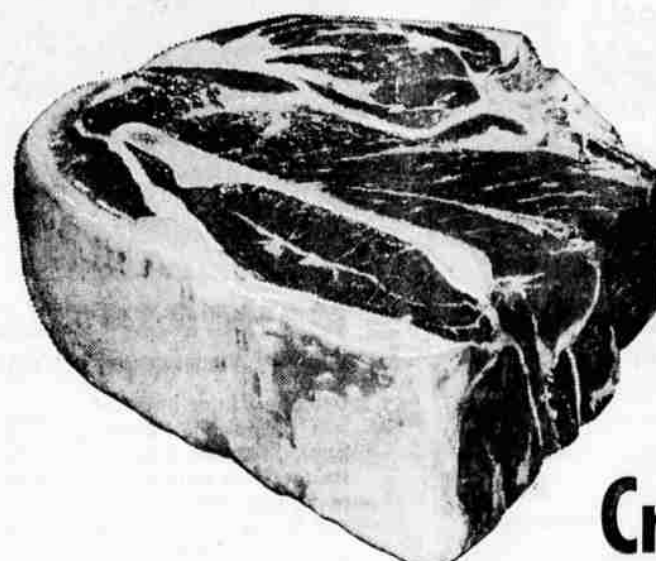

Hand Plays Both Ways

One of the late Sir Harry Lauder's most popular songs had a chorus that went something like, "Did you ever see a bridge hand go this way, go that way? Did you ever see a bridge hand go this way, go that way? Without going deeply into the merits of the North-South bidding I must point out that they arrived at a mighty good slam contract."

West thought about saving at seven diamonds, but finally decided that he might just as well try to get a small profit in the event that North and South were too high. He would have acquired that profit easily if he had opened a low diamond. East would have won with the jack and would have had no trouble figuring out the club return, but West opened the king of diamonds and the hand went "this way."

West shifted to the three of spades. Dummy's ace won and at this point South had a sure thing. He could lead a trump to his hand, ruff his last diamond in dummy, draw trumps and make his contract in spite of the 5-0 club break, but South was in too much of a hurry.

As soon as the ace of spades held he spread his hand with the announcement, "I'm drawing trumps," and the slam had gone "that way."

He was compelled to play trumps three times in order to draw them. After that he needed two discards on dummy's clubs which, of course, weren't forthcoming.

British Okay NATO Fleet

LONDON (UPI) — The United States today won British support for President Kennedy's plan for a NATO surface fleet carrying Polaris nuclear missiles.

An official communique issued at the end of two days of conferences here with presidential envoy Livingston T. Merchant said British ministers assured him of "continuing support for the idea" of the American plan.

The ministers expressed their "hopes of finding ways to participate in the project," the communique said.

At the same time, the United States pledged support for the British-sponsored idea of prompt creation of a NATO nuclear force composed of existing nuclear weapons of the United States, Britain and other allies.

The joint communique said further: "The conversations confirmed the agreement in principle between the two governments that a multi-lateral force would make an important contribution to the unity and strength of NATO."

British support for the American plan did not involve an immediate commitment to participate in the project. The British government has both technical and financial hesitations.

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
