Roosevelt Secretary Bid Faces Rough Questions

WASHINGTON (UPI) —Franklin D. Roosevelt Jr. was assured today of support for his nomination as undersecretary of commerce from at least one key Republican on the Senate Commerce Committee.

Sen. Norris Cotton, R-N.H., told the son of the late President that he would receive his vote because of his position with regard to guarding the textile industry from injury from foreign competition.

Other Republicans were less friendly to Roosevelt, but during his second day before the committee the questioning continued relatively mild. GOP senators had indicated they would give Roosevelt a rough time at the hearings on his nomination.

Other congressional developments:

TFX—A Senate subcommittee made public today testimony by a Navy air expert who told investigators Tuesday that the version of the TFX fighter plane accepted by the Pentagon civilian brass failed to meet original requirements for either the Air Force or Navy. The statement was by George Spangenberg, who made it clear that the Navy favored the proposals of the Boeing Aircraft Co., which were rejected in favor of designs submitted by General Dynamics. The TFX is to be an all-purpose plane for use on both land and sea.

Taxes — President Kennedy warned Congress, in effect, that if it departs drastically from his economic proposals on tax cuts, the budget and the debt ceiling, it will have to bear the blame if there is a recession. Kennedy said in a speech before the Advertising Council that if Congress gives "the wrong answer" to his proposals, the economy could turn downward.

News — FCC Chairman Newton Minow told a House subcommittee that joint ownership of newspapers and television stations in the same community sometimes is healthy in that it promotes a greater diversity of output of information and opinion. Minow testified at the opening of hearings on consolidations within the news media industries. The subcommittee emphasized it was not concerned with what various

media printed or broadcasted—only whether news dissemination might be curtailed by mergers.

Churchill — The House Tuesday voted overwhelmingly—but not unanimously—to bestow honorary citizenship on Sir Winston Churchill. The 21 "no" votes cast came as a sharp disappointment to backers of the resolution, who had hoped for unanimous approval.

The measure, which directs President Kennedy to "declare" honorary citizenship for the 89-year-old British statesman, now goes to the Senate for expected approval.

Those who opposed the resolution said they voted against the resolution because they feared it might dilute the prestige of normal citizenship and set an undesirable precedent.

Ratings—The owners of Conlan Associates Inc. were unable to tell a House commerce subcommittee who conducted four audience surveys the company sold to radio stations. The subcommittee staff said that in four surveys sold in the Tucson, Ariz., area in 1960 and 1961, the people who were supposed to have conducted the surveys either denied doing so or couldn't have done so. One woman was reported to have been in traction in a hospital at the time.

Disarmament—Dr. F. A. Long, the Disarmament Agency's top scientist, told the Senate-House Atomic Energy Committee that U.S. officials are "very conscious" of the risks involved in a nuclear test ban treaty. But he said they feel a treaty would be in the nation's best interest.

Scholarship Set

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Establishment of a \$500 Richard L. Neuberger memorial teachers' scholarship was announced Tuesday by Sen. Maurine Neuberger, D-Ore., widow of the senator.

She said a selection committee would name two teachers to receive two \$250 grants this year. The committee will be composed of Harold King of Portland, Gortee Corner of Eugene and Leland Hess of Monmouth.
