

Pacific Northwest Power Defends Stand On High Mountain Sheep Dam Construction

Pacific Northwest Power Company placed before the Federal Power Commission recently a vigorous defense of its position that building of the High Mountain Sheep Dam on the Snake River by the company will assure greater public benefits than if constructed by the federal government.

The legal filing was made in the Department of the Interior to an FPC examiner's recommendation that PNP be licensed to build the \$237,100,000 multi-purpose project between Oregon and Idaho.

Secretary of the Interior Stewart L. Udall has claimed that "public purposes" could best be served by federal construction at the site.

PNP legal counsel Hugh Smith, Portland, said the secretary's position was "emotional and political."

He urged the commission to reject the secretary's arguments for federal construction, and adopt the order of the examiner issuing a license to PNP.

The company reiterated in its filing that in all of the potential benefits of the High Mountain Sheep project—power, flood control, navigation, fisheries and recreation—development by PNP "will yield an equal or greater benefit than would development by the secretary."

The company told the commis-

sion that "the Federal Power Act does not create any priority for federal construction, but on the contrary is intended to encourage non-federal construction."

PNP said the assertion of the secretary that federal construction has a mandatory preference over any non-federal construction is "contrary to the clear meaning of the act, the consistent practice of the commission, the decisions of the courts and the actions of Congress."

Tracing the steady growth of electric facilities in the Pacific Northwest—built by both federal and non-federal agencies—the company referred to the program as "harmonious and coordinated."

PNP disagreed with the secretary that other new projects in the area could now permit further delay of High Mountain Sheep.

The company submitted the results of detailed studies showing that there will be a regional deficiency in the resources scheduled or expected to be available to meet the load as of 1969-70, increasing each year thereafter.

PNP told the commission that its four organizing companies will need the entire output of the High Mountain Sheep project as soon as the plant could be placed in service.

Written for Newspaper Enterprise Assn. If you labor under the apprehension that experts never get into bad contracts, take a look at the seven no-trump I had to play.

Part of the fault lay with my opening bid and rebid, but I still feel that my partner could have been a trifle less ambitious.

Anyway, there I was flying blind in a fog at seven no-trump. I did not really expect to make it, but intended to try and there was a slight chance.

I let dummy's queen of diamonds hold the first trick. Then I led the nine of clubs and overtook with my jack. For that nine of clubs play there was a reason.

A heart finesse succeeded and I led another club toward my hand and finessed my eight spot. I needed three entries. Now I tried the spade finesse which also worked. Back to my hand with the king of clubs in order to discard the six of hearts and queen of spades on my ace and king of diamonds and a second heart finesse was all I needed to wrap up my nice contract.

What was so important about the nine of clubs lead at trick two? Suppose I had led the deuce and won with the jack. When I led the clubs again if I had played the five East could stick in the ten and kill the third entry to my hand since dummy's nine would shut out my eight.
