Clairvoyant Play Works

When your opponents reach game on such simple bidding as one no-trump, three no-trump you must make a blind lead.

Any lead you make is likely to be wrong, but if you ask yourself, "How can I beat this hand?" you are likely to come up with a winner.

Look at the West hand. You have only two points, but your partner should have a lot more. Find his suit and you may wind up with a profit. His suit is most likely to be hearts, but he needs a really good suit to get anywhere. On the other hand if he has spades your queen will help him and a spade lead is clearly indicated.

You lead the deuce of spades and are delighted when your partner takes the ace and leads back the five.

South is most unhappy. If he is clairvoyant he can still make the hand by going up with the king of spades and knocking out the ace of hearts, but he doesn't know that you have led from three to the queen. He will surely finesse the jack.

You take your queen and lead back the six. Eventually, your partner will get in with the ace of hearts and cash two more spade tricks.

Government Removes Last Alcatraz Prisoner

SAN FRANCISCO (UP)—The last inmate of Alcatraz Federal Prison left the crumbling "Rock" in San Francisco Bay today and headed for other institutions.

The government is abandoning the maximum security prison because it would cost \$3 million to repair the deteriorating buildings which contributed to recent escape attempts.

Farmer Honored By Educators

PORTLAND (UPI)—S. E. Brogotti, a Helix farmer, was named the state's education citizen for 1963 at an Oregon Education Association convention banquet Thursday night.

Brogotti is vice chairman of the State Board of Education. He has been a member of the board for 12 years. Mrs. James King of Sherwood won the award last year.

Rep. Robert Duncan, D - Ore., spoke at the banquet.

The 60th annual convention ends Saturday.

The last inmate to leave the 29-year-old island prison was Frank C. Weatherman, age 29, a gun smuggler who was transferred here Dec. 14, 1962, for attempting twice to break out of the Anchorage jail.

Asked by a reporter how it felt to be the last man off "The Rock" the blond, boyish-looking convict smiled thinly and said:

"Good. Good for me. Good for everyone. Alcatraz never was no good."

Weatherman was the last of 27 inmates, handcuffed and wearing leg and waist chains, who filed aboard the Alcatraz prison boat "Warden Blackwell" for the 10-minute trip on San Francisco Bay to Fort Mason Army dock. There a chartered bus transported them to an undisclosed airport where a U. S. Immigration Service airplane took them to their new institutions at Leavenworth, Kan.; McNeil Island, Wash.; Lewisburg, Pa., or Atlanta, Ga.

A few moments after the 60-foot diesel boat left Alcatraz, prison Officer Gordon Gronzo formally closed the 100-foot Tower No. 1 on the east side of the island as he came down the steps carrying a rifle and wearing another shag over his shoulder along with a cartridge belt.

The prison is scheduled to be officially turned over to the General Services Administration at the end of June and declared surplus.

Congressmen from California are currently sponsoring legislation to establish a commission that will determine the future of the island.
