When the President's Committee on Foreign Aid reported to the White House, everybody was out of step except the AFL-CIO's George Meany.
Nine of the 10 committee members agreed that the United States was wasting money in an effort to do too much for too many too fast. Meany disagreed. The committee, including Meany, were men of proven ability, as established by the record. Meany's dissent did not mean much: One good man against nine, or maybe, it meant a great deal. Could it mean, for example, that the leadership of Big Labor is losing contact with the mainstream of American thought, that the Grand Panjandrum of organized labor are losing the common touch?

That is what happened to the 19th Century, public-be-damned American capitalists. These men, who suddenly acquired an unimaginable riches and public power, drifted off their own private, golden clouds to live in a dreary world of Nonsense.

Other Labor Hassles
This dreamy existence lasted only long enough for the Federal and state governments to discover and to abolish it. Meany's dissent alone would not justify these hassles. But there has been more. There has been, for example, in New York the strike of nine newspapers serving that community and, in Cleveland, likewise.

Most of the nation's seaports recently were knocked out by strike action. The railroad unions are jarring the economy with strike threats to protect their discredited make-work featherbedding.
