## POLLY'S POINTERS

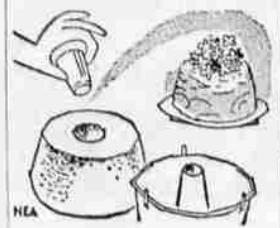
Novel Hair Spray Use

DEAR POLLY—I have found a way to make my hair behave after a shampoo. If the hair is slightly and full of static electricity, just spray your hairbrush with hair spray. This makes the hair behave without the sticky, stiff feeling that often results from the use of too much spray directly on the hair. —DORA

DEAR POLLY—For smoother



ironing, I am sure most of the girls run their irons over a piece of white candle or paraffin. To save time, melt wax on a pot holder and attach to the ironing board cover with a large safety pin. The pad can be dropped over the edge of the board, out of the way, while ironing. When the iron seems "sluggish," run it over

the paraffin or candle on the pad. —E.L.

My sincere thanks, Mrs. E. L.'s idea is certainly an improvement over my former messy way of using melted candle on a folded piece of newspaper. —POLLY

DEAR POLLY—For a pretty cake, use an angel food cake baked in a tube pan. Fill a jelly glass with water and place it in the hole. Arrange flowers in the glass. For a bride's luncheon, I use white icing on the cake and white flowers. Suit your frosting and flowers to the season or the occasion. —MRS. D.N.J.

DEAR POLLY—When shortening trousers, try them on the person and turn the trouser leg up, on the right side, to the required length. Pin on the fold. Press the new bottom fold line with the steam iron. Turn trouser leg down again and from the pressed fold measure the desired width of the cuff. Fold the remaining length to the wrong side. Press again on this line. I usually allow about two and a half inches for the underneath hem and cut off the excess length. After making the hem, turn cuff up again on the first fold and you have the proper length without pins falling out and all guesswork is eliminated. Sounds complicated but is really easy. —THREE-TROUSER MOTHER

GIRLS—I wish I had a dollar for every pair I had turned up this way. After the cuff is turned up, I always tack it in place, at each trouser seam, making stitches that catch the cuff to the pants but that do not come through to the outside. —POLLY.
