

White Sox Getting Best Of Oriole Trade From Nicholson, Ward

Which team got the better of the big trade between the Chicago White Sox and the Baltimore Orioles this winter?

Former \$125,000 bonus baby Dave Nicholson is trying to settle that question all by himself this spring. The big outfielder, who spent five frustrating years in the Baltimore organization, drove in five runs with a home run, double and single Thursday to give the White Sox a 9-5 ex-

hibition victory over the Cincinnati Reds at Macon, Ga.
Nicholson was traded from the Orioles along with shortstop Ron Hansen, pitcher Hoyt Wilhelm, and infielder Pete Ward to the White Sox for shortstop Luis Aparicio and outfielder Al Smith in mid-January.
Ward Helps Out
Ward, who already has won the White Sox' third base job, contributed a homer and a single in Thursday's victory in mid-January.

which Chicago rapped out 13 hits against Joe Nuxhall and Al Worthington. After giving up a two-run homer to Jerry Lynch in the first inning, Ray Herbert of the White Sox settled down to four scoreless innings as a tune-up for Tuesday's opener.
In other exhibition games, the New York Yankees blanked the Pittsburgh Pirates, 2-0; the St. Louis Cardinals routed the Minnesota Twins, 12-3; the Detroit Tigers edged the New York Mets, 3-2; the Washington Senators edged the Orioles, 4-3; the Chi-

cago Cubs beat the Los Angeles Dodgers, 6-2; the Milwaukee Braves topped the Philadelphia Phillies, 9-2; the Houston Colts downed the Los Angeles Angels, 3-2; and the Cleveland Indians out-slugged the San Francisco Giants, 11-7.
Yankee pitchers Jim Bouton, Luis Arroyo and Hal Reniff duled Curt Flood sparked the Cardinals over the Twins. Ray Sadecki pitched five innings for the out only four hits to the Pirates. Arroyo, making a strong comeback, worked two strong innings

and has allowed only one earned run in 13 innings this spring.

Cool Veal's two-out, two-run single in the 10th inning provided the Tigers with a come-from-behind triumph over the Mets.

Low Burdette, Hank Fischer and Frank Funk of the Braves stopped the Phils on three hits. Five Angel errors and Ernie Fazio's three-run homer helped the Colts to victory.

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Giant Pitchers Will Fight Back

STOCKTON, Calif. (UPI)—The world would become outraged and fines would be thrown all over the place... As for the game itself, Cleveland tagged Sanford at will as they bombed 13 hits, 4 homers, and 11 runs in his 5 1/3 innings of hurling.
But Bob Bolin and John Prezenger each surrendered only one hit. Prezenger, a big rookie who has come out of nowhere, apparently is now the Giants number one short relief man.
San Francisco collected seven hits as Willie McCovey and Felipe Alou whacked homers.

More good news for the Giants occurred when Matty Alou and Billy Hoelt returned to limited action.
Hoelt still can't get his arm above his shoulder, but he said it feels "100 per cent improved." Alou, hobbled by a knee sprain, took a long turn at the batting cage.
San Francisco again met Cleveland here today. It could be a tough one.
American League umpire John Rice walked to the mound and warned Sanford—a move that would have cost Sanford \$50 automatically during the regular season.
That brought Dark out to ask why Weaver had not been similarly warned. His protest resulted in the thump.
Long after Dark had left, Sanford had to duck a head-searcher thrown by Sonny Siebert, which found Cleveland pilot Birdy Tebbets drawing a warning.
