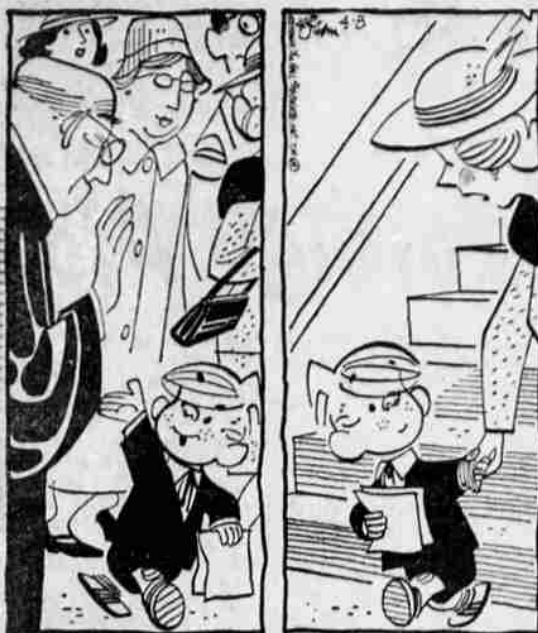

Syria, Iraq Talk Egypt Federation

CAIRO, U.A.R. (UPI)—Syrian and Iraqi delegations flew into Cairo Saturday to work out details of their nations' proposed federation with President Gamal Abdel Nasser's Egypt.

Nasser called separate meetings Saturday with the two delegations before the formal three-nation talks begin in the secluded republic palace. Start of the talks marks a vital moment in the future of the turbulent Middle East.

The 17-man Syrian delegation, led by National Revolutionary Council Chairman Gen. Luayy El Atassi and including Premier Salah Bitar, flew in early Saturday from Damascus, where demonstrations earlier last week forced a government shuffle.

A few hours later the six-man Iraqi delegation, led by Premier Ahmad Hassan El Bakr, arrived. Both delegations were met by Ali Sabry.

The Syrian government difficulties cast an immediate shadow over the talks. In the shuffle the governing Ba'athist Party—which stands for Arab unity but has feuded with Nasser in recent years—was forced to share its power with non-Ba'athists.

Success in the talks would create a giant federation of nearly 40 million Arabs from the northeast corner of Africa to the Asian borders of Turkey and Iran.

Failure, however, could strike a serious blow at the whole concept of Arab unity.

Syrian leaders have said that, if the federation is formed, they would like to see Algeria and the Yemen also join it.

Differences between Nasser and the Syrian Ba'athist leaders threatened earlier to force a delay in the talks, which first opened here last month.

Japan Raps Peking Buy, Pay Policies

TOKYO (UPI)—Prime Minister Hayato Ikeda's denunciation of Peking's trade policies stirred speculation Saturday over the future of business dealings between Japan and Communist China.

Ikeda told a political rally in southern Japan Friday that Red China's buy-now pay-later policy makes it impossible to do business.

It was the bitterest official Japanese criticism of Peking's trade practices since Tokyo and Peking signed a \$300 million "private" trade agreement last November.

His remarks reflected increasing Japanese disillusionment over trade with Red China. They also appeared to bear out warnings from U. S. officials that Japan had nothing to gain and much to lose by expanding trade with the Chinese Communists.

"The Chinese Communists refuse to accept normal deferred payment terms but propose instead that they should take delivery of goods and pay for them at some later date," Ikeda said. "This makes it impossible to do business with them."

He also said Japan is no longer interested in buying coal from the Reds, a major item in the barter agreement, "because of its poor quality."

Japan had hoped the trade agreement would open new markets in China for Japanese goods. But Ikeda's remarks indicated that unless the Reds changed their business methods, there was little chance trade between the two countries would rise much above the 1962 level of \$46 million.

Russia, U.S. Probe Possibilities Of Returning Man From Moon Trip

CAPE CANAVERAL (UPI)—No exception—particularly coming as it did, in the midst of sundry congressional hearings.

And there always has been a tendency toward somewhat exaggerated interpretations—or guesses—of just what the Russians might be up to. This one, again, was no exception.

Cape Canaveral has long been criticized for accepting Russian space accomplishments with a shrug of the shoulders while the rest of the country jumps up and down. But the Cape is well stocked with brains that can separate technical soundness from spectacular headlines.

Which is another way of saying that Cape Canaveral generally gets upset about such things when there is something technically worth getting upset about. With Lunik-4, there wasn't.

Politically Astute
But the Russians are politically quite astute. This alone, it would seem, probably rules out the possibility that a Soviet cosmonaut might be sent on a one-way trip to the moon.

Sending a man off into space with no chance of getting back alive could be a difficult thing to explain, even by the masterful Soviet propaganda machine. People and nations tend to frown upon such things.

Speculation about a Russian manned one-way flight into space is as old as the space age itself. It flared anew when the Soviet Union sent its Lunik-4 probe soaring toward the moon April 2. Some experts in this country interpreted it as meaning Russia was on the verge of shooting a man to that nearest of heavenly neighbors.

For some reason, an agonizing appraisal of the U.S. space program by experts and non-experts alike always follows a Soviet space spectacular. This one was

The Russian moon probe weighed 3,139 pounds. It was a sizeable piece of machinery. But from another standpoint, that is just a shade over the weight of the bell-shaped Mercury capsule that the United States has used in putting its first astronauts into orbit.

The Mercury program's sardine can qualities have been dwelt upon at length. An astronaut would find it mighty tough going indeed if he had to spend several days in a spaceship this size going to the moon.

No Return Rockets
He could make it to the moon in a spaceship as big—or as small—as Lunik-4—or one even smaller, for that matter, if he were willing to go light on food, water and breathing. But there just would not be enough room to cart along rockets for a return trip.

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Need For Pan-Am Highway Underscored By Legislator

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Rep. Jim Wright, 40-year-old Spanish-speaking Texan, told Congress Saturday the Pan-American highway "must" be completed.

The Fort Worth legislator filed a 46-page report on a trip he made over the highway for the House Public Works Committee. The trip included a 3-day safari-type jaunt into the jungles of Darien, an almost totally unexplored isthmus, jutting north from the South American continent and owned by Panama and Colombia.

"Undoubtedly the completion of this highway will be the most tangible significant and concrete action in which the United States has ever participated in Latin America," Wright wrote. He added:

"Symbolically, it will stand as a monument to the persevering cooperation by which good neighbors working together can overcome obstacles and transform a grand design from the drawing board to fruition and reality."

"Moreover, the economic, industrial and social impact of a really workable road system to connect the American nations and penetrate the isolation of hitherto backward areas would be easy to underestimate."

"Latin America is a sleeping giant, beginning to stir from its long slumbers. Already the wheels of change are in motion. Certainly it is to our national advantage that this change be guided in the upland paths of constructive development and not allowed to degenerate into the low gutters of violence and bitter unfulfillment."

Wright explained that many persons confuse the Inter-American highway with the Pan-American highway. This confusion is natural, because eventually it is hoped both will be part of the same system. Although the Pan-American high-

way is already a reality, the vital Darien Gap will have to be conquered before North and South America are truly linked in a Pan-Hemispheric road system.

For purposes of the record, the Pan-American highway starts near Fairbanks, Alaska, and ends in Argentina. When completed it will be the longest continuous stretch of highway on earth. "For almost 19,000 miles one ribbon of pavement would span the Western Hemisphere from the ice-jacketed tundra of Alaska to Tierra Del Fuego at the southernmost tip of South America," in Wright's words.

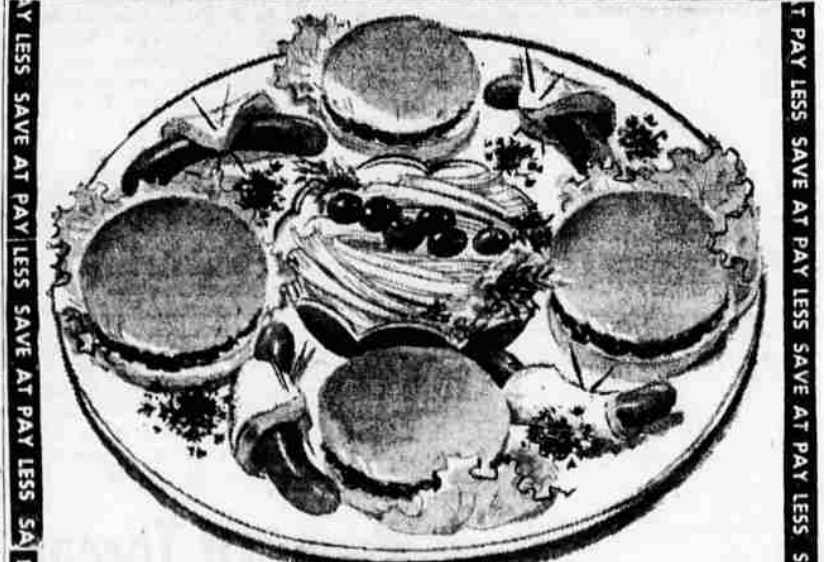
