PORTLAND (UPI) — Allan L. Kelly, president of the Oregon Izaak Walton League, said today the league opposed proposed legislation calling for an overhaul of Oregon's natural resource agencies.

Kelly referred to a report that the bill would receive support from commercial and sports fishing groups.

He said the league had stated its opposition to the fish and game section of the basic bill at a public hearing.

"Some years ago," he said, "the Oregon division went on record in favor of the combining of the Fish and Game Commissions but it cannot go along with combining these commissions under the framework of the present bill as amended."

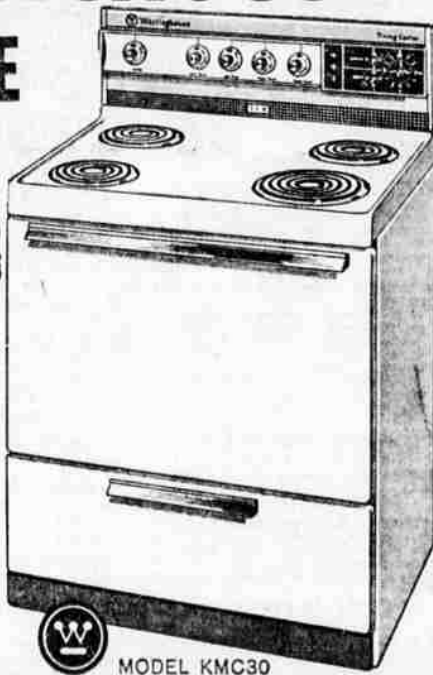
