

Lifesaving Class Dated At KU Pool

Robert J. Dionne, representative of the National Red Cross, will participate in the swim training program scheduled to open April 15 at 7 p.m. at the KUHS pool.

Dionne engaged in competitive swimming from 1947 to 1953; after graduation from Western Washington State College he directed swim programs in Yakima for the Recreation Department and the YMCA. His current assignment with the Red Cross is first aid and water safety representative for Oregon and Washington.

Swimmers of the Basin wishing to qualify for service at community lakes and pools are invited to register for the course immediately. Senior lifesaving classes will run April 15 through the 26th, to be followed by instructors courses April 29 through May 17. Students should bring suits and towels and women swimmers must wear caps. Ella Hedeky and other water safety instructors will conduct the senior lifesaving and preliminary training for the instructors course.

The water safety instructors course is given only once a year in this area by the Red Cross in cooperation with KUHS, the YMCA, and the City Recreation Department. The course is given without charge, and all interested are invited to enroll immediately by contacting the Red Cross office, TU 4-4125.

Four Killed On Klamath Highways In February

Four people were killed in three traffic accidents in Klamath County during February, according to an Oregon State Highway Department report which states that 23 persons died and 17 others were injured on the state's highways during that month.

One of the three fatal accidents noted in the county occurred 10 miles north of Klamath Falls on Highway 97, where a southbound automobile struck a bridge abutment and went off the road, resulting in the death of the motorist and a passenger.

Another accident also occurred on Highway 97, eight miles north of Modoc Point, and resulted in the death of a motorist following a two-car collision at the intersection of the highway and the Chilquin road.

The third fatality took place on Old Fort Road, approximately one and one-half miles east of Klamath Falls, when a motorist lost control of his automobile on a curve and overturned.

Fifteen of the 23 traffic victims died on rural state highways, according to the report.

Wine Stealing Charged Man

A Klamath Falls man was apprehended at the Low Cost Market, Town and Country Shopping Center, about 5 p.m. Tuesday, after he was charged with stealing a bottle of wine from the store, Oregon State Police have reported.

Booked and held in the Klamath County Jail was Huey Wayne Hicks, 20, of 615 Commercial Street, who was scheduled for arraignment in district court sometime Wednesday.

The complaint was signed by Dale Hayden, manager of the market, who observed Hicks take a bottle of wine from a shelf and place it under his belt, police said.

Traffic Increases On Klamath County Highways

Traffic counts on four major highways in Klamath County during February increased substantially over the same month one year ago, according to the Oregon State Highway Department.

The countywide increase in traffic was in accord with a pattern noted throughout the state during the same period, a department report showed. A percentage increase of 7.3 was indicated for routes, while urban highways had a 9.2 per cent increase in travel over the same period a year ago.

Increases were especially noted on Highways 1-5, 1-90N, US97, and US101.

Maximum traffic for the month occurred Sunday, Feb. 24, at a majority of rural highway counter locations, but nearly as many counter locations indicated Sunday, Feb. 10, to be the maximum day of travel.

Continued mild weather was credited largely for the overall increase in travel. Log hauling operations, which normally terminate in February because of bad weather, have continued in many areas.

In Klamath County, the greatest percentage increase in traffic was noted on OR22 at Fort Klamath, where traffic counters showed that 23.8 per cent more vehicles passed that point in February than did the same month for the previous year.

Other highways registering increases in their order of finish follow: Chemult, OR297,

14.7 per cent; Beatty, OR266, 13.1; Midland, US 97, 11.9; and Merrill, 7.9. The average number of vehicles per day at Merrill, where an average of 2,044 vehicles passed through the county was high; the city daily.
