

Stud Book Publication Date Slated

ALTURAS — William Diekroeger of the Model Quarter Horse Association announced this week that the first Stud Book of the MQHA will roll off the presses between April 8 and 12.

The first printing of the 300-page book will be 2000 copies and will list 7000 registered horses. The book will contain a history of the association and information on the breed and personal data will be given on each of the listed horses. The price of the attractive bound volume will \$10. Diekroeger said that to date there are over 9000 horses registered in the association.

The MQHA now has 93 inspectors in 48 states, Canada and Mexico. Horses are registered in 46 states, Canada, Mexico, France and Columbia. Application is now pending for inclusion in the official USDA booklet, The Light Horse. Application has been made to the California State Fair Board Commission for inclusion in the state fair premium books as a specific breed. The MQHA is already recognized by the fair commissions in all other states.

The first futurity for two-year-olds in the Model Quarter Horse Association will be held in June of 1964 in Arizona. This 350-yard race will be open to colts and fillies that foal in 1963. There is a guaranteed purse of \$2500.

Lions To Ask Dunsmuir To Take Over Building

DUNSMUIR—The city of Dunsmuir will be asked to assume ownership of the Community Youth Building, recently completed under Lions Club sponsorship.

The move was initiated by the Lions Club at its weekly luncheon Monday to put the building under public ownership and remove the possibility of a property tax burden.

The 40 x 80 concrete block building, adjacent to the Dunsmuir ball park, was completed last year and dedicated to youth activities and community use.

Construction was started with funds derived from the sale of the Lions Club Scout Hut. The hut was in the path of the freeway through Dunsmuir and its sale provided the club with a little over \$10,000 to begin the new building.

Donated materials and labor, plus contributions from civic organizations, went into the new building which is now valued at over \$30,000. Gary Girdler, project chairman, noted at the meeting.

The Lions Club will offer to continue to manage the building on a lease arrangement if the city accepts title.

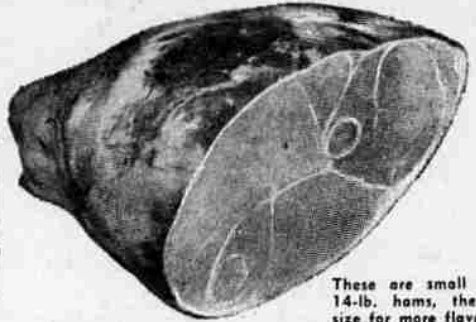

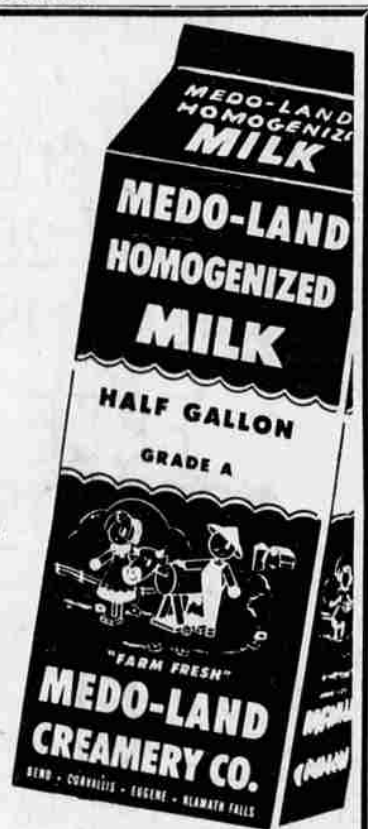
