The cutting horse show will bring up to 150 champion horses from all over the United States.

William Diekroeger, manager of the Model Quarter Horse Association in Alturas, said, "There is no question that this cutting horse contest will be the largest in the United States in 1963. We have a guaranteed purse of \$3000 with the entry fees to be added."

The Model Quarter Horse Association has donated \$1000 to the purse, and entry fees will be \$100 per horse. Points from the show will go toward the 1963 world championship of the National Cutting Horse Association.

judging with Elliot will be B. M. Williams of Boonville, Mo. Williams is the performance adviser of the Model Quarter Horse Association and a recognized judge of the NCHA.

A pancake breakfast at the park in Alturas will start the events rolling on the Fourth of July, followed by the largest parade ever to tour the streets of a Northern California town. Along with the floats presented by the commercial, civic, and private groups vying for the trophies and prizes, there will be horse groups representing riding clubs throughout the northern area. The Clydesdale Hitch of the Budweiser breweries is one of the early entries along with the Sixth Army Band, the Alameda Naval Air Station Band, and the Marine Corps Band from the 13th district. The theme of the parade, in keeping with the traditional fourth, will be the Goddess of Liberty.

A noon barbecue and the Poquito Vaqueros rodeo at the Modoc Quarter show grounds will follow the parade. The Poquito Vaqueros will bring forth the rough and tough cowboys from 6 to 16 and feature steer riding, bare back colt riding, goat tying and all "little britches" rodeo events.

A pageant depicting the history of the last frontier of the west will be shown at the Modoc Quarter Horse grounds in the evening. Here in the original setting will be seen the blood curdling and heroic stories of the men who settled Modoc County and Northern California.

On July 5 the cutting horse contest and a fried chicken lunch will be held at the show grounds. A cowboy street dance in Alturas will top the day.

More than 150 horses, registered American quarter horses and Model quarter horses, will be offered for sale at the horse sale which will close the events on July 7.
