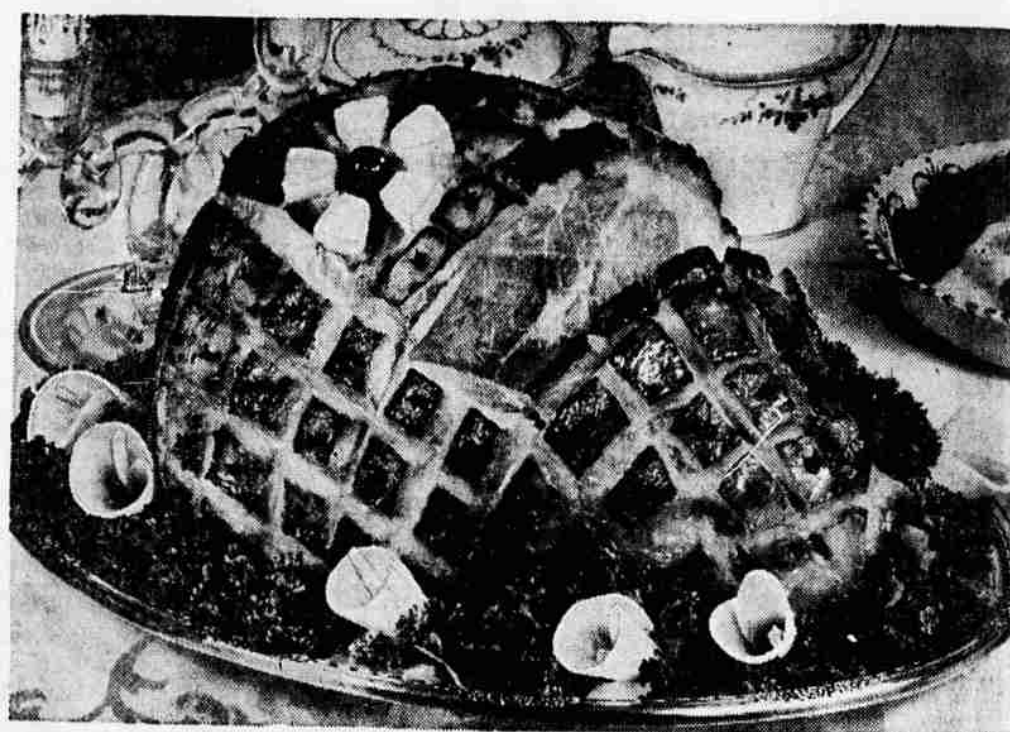

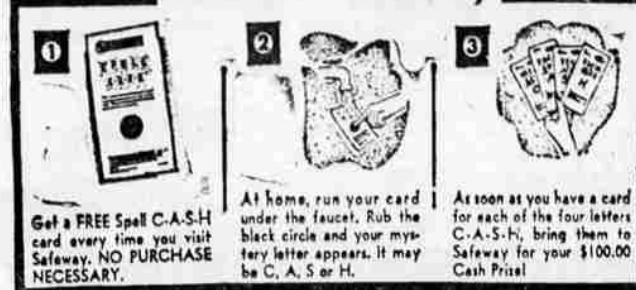

**Cue Bids  
Used Often**

In the early days of contract  
bridge the cue bid of an opponent's suit  
meant only one thing. First round  
control.

In modern expert usage it is  
used any time a player with a  
strong hand can find no better  
bid. Sometimes it does show first  
round control, sometimes it is an  
invitation to no-trump, still other  
times it merely is a general type  
slam try to show second round  
control.

South holds only 12 points in  
high cards, but his hand is strong  
in distribution so after his part-  
ner jumps to four clubs South  
has definite interest in a club  
slam. His problem is how to show  
this interest.

He can use Blackwood and if  
North shows two aces South can  
safely bid six clubs, but if  
North shows only one ace South  
will have dug himself into a hole  
with no way out. North probably  
has two aces, but he could have  
a sound four-club bid with only  
one ace so four no-trump is a  
bad bid.

The right bid is four diamonds.  
It is possible that North will be-  
lieve that South is showing first  
round control and jump to six  
with only one ace, but North has  
already bid pretty strongly and  
is unlikely to go slam crazy with-  
out two aces.

The four diamond bid makes  
things easy for North. He con-  
siders going to seven, but abandons  
that idea. He has bid a heart  
and jumped in clubs with only  
13 high card points so he contents  
himself with the lay-down six  
clubs.
