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CHICKIE CATCH-A-TORY — To make bake two seven or eight-inch diameter cake layers, using favorite recipe or mix. Use one layer for body and cut head, tail, and feet from second layer. Cut and assemble on cake board. Frost in white. Outline entire form of Chickie with yellow frosting, using pastry tube. Outline wing in yellow and use green for wing lines and grass effect at feet. The eye is dab of red frosting or a cinnamon candy.

Use Plentiful Foods For Easter

Since pork has been named an April Food-of-the-Month by the United States Department of Agriculture, wise homemakers can build their Easter menus around juicy baked ham without throwing their budgets for a loss.

In addition to pork, carrots and potatoes also will be abundant. They are also on the plentiful list. Other April plentiful foods are eggs, canned freestone peaches and ripe olives. So there's your Easter dinner.

Buy the ham of your choice, score the fat and stud with whole cloves, then bake according to the directions on the package.

COLORFUL MEAL
Serve the ham garnished with drained, canned freestone peach halves, centers of which are filled with currant jelly, tart cranberry sauce or simply sprinkled with a bit of spice. Accompany with baked stuffed potatoes—add a bit of chopped chives or green onion, for zesty flavor — buttered carrots and mushrooms. Pass a relish tray of radishes, celery sticks and ripe olives.

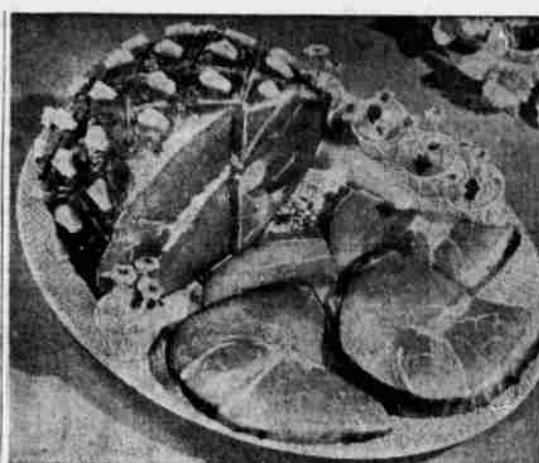

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Spicy Treat

Looking for a new breakfast treat? Try French-style pancakes rolled around crisp bacon and accompanied by warm spicy peaches. Place drained canned cling peach halves on broiler rack. Dot with butter and cinnamon. Broil until warm and lightly browned. For each 6-inch pancake, beat together 1 tablespoon each flour and creamy cottage cheese, 1 egg and a pinch of salt. Pour into lightly buttered frying pan, cooking about 2 minutes on each side. Spread with butter and a light sprinkle of sugar. Roll around a strip of cooked bacon.

Parboil green peppers before stuffing, then bake them in a moderate oven. Cover the stuffing with buttered crumbs.



DRESS IT UP — What better garnish can be found for this Easter ham than Pineapple? It dresses it up and defines flavor too.

Spring Look For Easter Ham

To give your Easter ham the look of spring, garnish with little cups of carrot and pineapple flowers with bright green parsley for foliage.

Remove ham from oven about ½ hour before serving and cut diagonal lines across the fat to form a diamond design. Cover the surface with your own special glaze and return the ham to the oven. After it has completed its cooking schedule, attach small pineapple wedges on food picks in center of each diamond.

A pineapple garnish in paper cups sprouting carrot posies will give the perfect finishing touch to your Easter ham platter. For those leftovers which are always anticipated, try the recipe for Ham-Creamed Corn Skillet.

each "flower" on a pick. Top the flowers with a bit of parsley. Insert 3 or 4 picks into pineapple mixture in paper cups, makes it look like a flower pot.

HAM-CREAMED CORN SKILLET
4 to 5 slices cooked ham
¼ cup chopped onion
1 tablespoon butter
1-pound can cream-style corn
¼ teaspoon pepper
1 teaspoon dry mustard
¼ teaspoon paprika
2 tablespoons chopped pimento
½ cup grated cheese
Fry onion in melted butter in a skillet until onion is tender but not browned. Add remaining ingredients. Cook over low heat until cheese is melted, stirring occasionally. Top with ham slices. Cover skillet. Heat 10 minutes over low heat. Serve hot.

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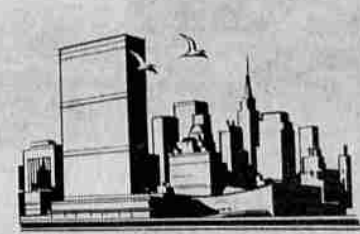

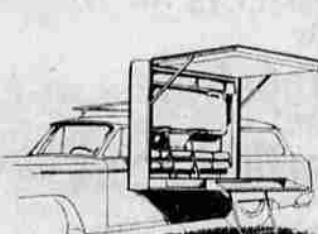

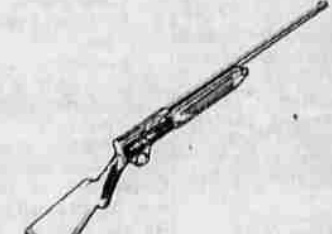
