



NEW HOME FOR KINGSLEY FIELD SHOPS — Construction of a new steel building to house the vehicle maintenance shops at Kingsley Field was underway this week and is slated for completion July 27 at a cost to the government of \$255,000. The contract for the project was let to Thompson and Georgeson, Inc., Portland, with the subcontract for the fabrication and the erection of the steel frame going to the

Sabre Steel Building Company, also of Portland. The vehicle maintenance shops are scheduled to move from their present location in the motor pool building to the new structure sometime in August. The airfield did not disclose its plans for the building being vacated. Installation costs of all utility lines are included in the contract price, according to Lt. (jg) William C. Pflugh, officer-in-charge of construction. — USAF Photo

First Federal Dividend Up

The directors of the First Federal Savings and Loan Association of Klamath Falls last week announced a dividend increase payable June 30 to the association savers.

The new rate will be 4 1/2 per cent per annum and is up from the 4 per cent dividend paid Dec. 31, 1962. The dividend will be payable at the close of the semi-annual period, June 30, and the increased rate is retroactive to Jan. 1, 1963.

"The association's earnings on its investments make possible the increase at this time," stated George W. McIntyre, president.

This is in line with its policy to return to its savers all funds over and above the amount needed for adequate reserves. Savings totals of the association have reached a new high and stood at \$24,548,565 as of March 31, 1963.



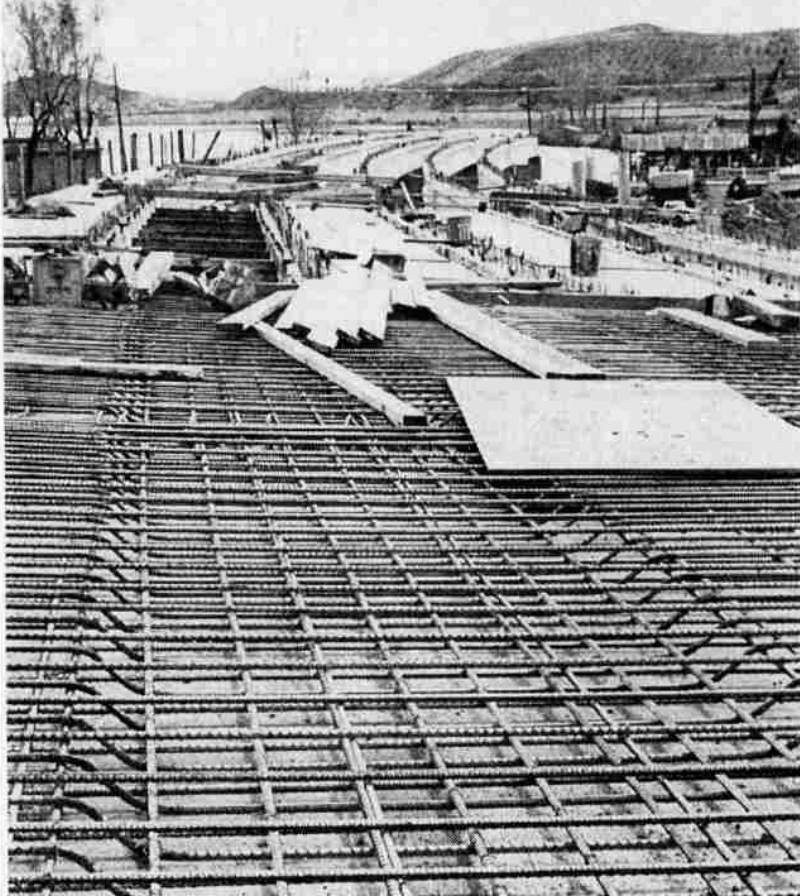

BRIDGE GOING UP — The continued touch of wintry-type weather has not slowed construction of the big bridge that will span Lake Ewauna and provide a new terminus for the south end of the west side bypass to Klamath Falls. This view was taken from the peak of the present bypass looking across Lake Ewauna to the point where it will join the embankment on the south side. The Tom Lillebo Construction Company is building the bridge and estimated cost of construction is \$861,000. Traffic, meantime, is free to flow down the bypass to the Main Street junction and then over the old Link River bridge. The new bridge cuts through one of the most historically important spots of the city. It was here on the shores of Link River and Lake Ewauna that the city of Klamath Falls had its origination 96 years ago when George Nurse built a cabin and a store and the community of Linkville began, later to be renamed Klamath Falls.
